#### On-line Merit Badge College November 21, 2020

Buckskin Council will be hosting another on-line Merit Badge College on Saturday, November 21. Two sessions will be offered. The first session will be from 9:00am to noon. The second session will be from 1:00pm to 4:00pm.

There is no fee for these sessions, but Scouts are required to register and complete the pre-requisites for the badges they wish to earn. The on-line catalog, available on the Council website, contains the schedule and the pre-requisite for each session.

Pre-reqs are to be emailed prior to the merit badge session to the counselor. The counselor's email will be provided in the course catalog.

This event will be conducted using Zoom Video Conferencing. Internet links to each merit badge session will be emailed to participants. Access to the Zoom sessions will be open approximately 15 minutes prior to the scheduled session start time. Full details are included in the on-line course catalog.

#### Cub Scout Adventure Videos add to a Den Leader's Bag of Tricks

Figuring out how to create a fun den meeting in a virtual setting can feel overwhelming. Now the National Council and 50 councils across the country worked together to produce Cub Scout Adventures videos to help den leaders. They are a series of short videos, prepared by councils, to align with Adventures for each Cub Scout rank. Scouting volunteers and council professionals recruited local subject matter experts to create these videos that cover 96 Cub Scout Adventures. Many of these videos were filmed by den leaders and Scouts, too.

Use these videos to enhance your virtual den meetings; they don't take the place of the program designed and presented in the Den Leader Experience or Cub Scout handbooks. However, during the COVID-19 pandemic, these and other virtual resources may be used to complete requirements, such as virtual tours instead of den outings.

#### Wilderness First Aid Class

Wilderness First Aid is required for backcountry trips and excursions. "Backcountry" is defined as anywhere that medical care is one hour or more away.

A Wilderness First Aid Course will be taught November 6-7 at Camp Arrowhead in Ona, WV. Register now because slots are filling up quickly. Class size is limited to 20 participants.

The fee is \$75 and includes program materials, cracker barrel on Friday, snacks and a continental breakfast on Saturday. Participants are responsible for their own meals. Time will be permitted to run out to local restaurants. It is suggested that you eat dinner before arriving. For those who wish to stay overnight, arrangements can be made for lodging at Camp Arrowhead. Bring your own personal gear.

Certification is provided through Emergency Care and Safety Institute (ECSI).

#### **Scouting For Food**

As Scouts, we know how fortunate we are to have a warm meal every night — whether around the campfire or at the kitchen table. And we know that not everyone is so lucky. That's the genesis of Scouting for Food, the annual food collection drive run by the council. It's another reminder to our local communities that Scouts are here, doing good turns.

Scouting for Food takes place on two consecutive weekends. On the first weekend, Scouts distribute bags to let their neighbors know about the drive. On the second, Scouts revisit those houses to pick up bags full of canned food, cereal, pasta, peanut butter, juice and other nonperishable items.

The bags do not have a date on them so units who cannot do the distribution on November 7th and pick up on November 14th may choose their own weekends to do the drive. # Member Care Support Transitioning to Local Councils

Beginning September 1, 2020, BSA's Member Care Contact Center will no longer directly serve volunteers and will shift to exclusively serving council employees so that they can address local volunteer needs. As a result, volunteers that contact the Member Care Contact Center will be directed to their local council for assistance.

In addition to taking steps to provide councils with the tools and training needed to facilitate this transition, they are also streamlining processes that previously required significant support from Member Care, including:

- Making it easier to create a new password via My.Scouting.org using your member ID
- Instituting a Google Sign-on
- Enabling members to correct ID numbers through the "Manage Member ID" tool in My.Scouting

Did you know you can check your training status on my.scouting.org? Be sure yours is current and not expired. If your record is not showing a training, please reach out to the training chairs asap.

Check on your unit! My.scouting.org allows Key Three leaders\*\* in every unit to review their leaders training status. Youth Protection training expires. Check on it. You can take any training you find there to expand your scouting experience as well.

#### INTRODUCTION TO OUTDOOR LEADER SKILLS

OCTOBER 2 & 3, 2020 - CAMP ARROWHEAD

What is IOLS? The Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Positions-Specific Training and Varsity Coach Position-Specific Training and provides Scouters with the confidence to take youth into the outdoors.

- > Gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a boy-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead scouts in the out-of-doors. In addition, the teaching methods, activities, and games model the variety of teaching used in effective and engaging Scouting programs.
- ➤ Hands-on participation is the best learning tool, and this course models the techniques used by effective Scoutmasters, and other leaders in the Scouting program. Attendees will see and experience different aspects of how Scouting works while playing the role of Scouts in a troop.
