

## **Camp Director Position Opening**

Buckskin Council is looking for an enthusiastic, customeroriented individual to serve as the Camp Director of Camp Kootaga's summer camp program. Camp Kootaga will serve approximately 450 Scouts in summer, 2021 through Cub Scout and Scouts BSA resident camp programs.

The Camp Director is responsible for the overall operation of the summer camp program at Camp Kootaga and serves as the face of the Buckskin Council and the Boy Scouts of America to those in camp.

This position supervises and coordinates the work of approximately 40 paid seasonal camp staff, as well as many volunteers who aid in program delivery and operational support. The position is a "Management Level" position, and skills such as strong interpersonal communication, employee management, budgeting, and program delivery are vital to the success of the role. In addition to the salary, meals and housing are included during the summer camp season.

The Camp Director must be at least age 21, be willing to be a registered member of the Buckskin Council, Boy Scouts of America, and live on site during the summer camp operation from approximately June 9 to July 30, 2021. This position requires National Camp School Camp Management certification, qualified candidates must be able to complete this training prior to the camp season start.

## **Scouting For Food**

As Scouts, we know how fortunate we are to have a warm meal every night — whether around the campfire or at the kitchen table. And we know that not everyone is so lucky. That's the genesis of Scouting for Food, the annual food collection drive run by the council. It's another reminder to our local communities that Scouts are here, doing good turns.

Scouting for Food takes place on two consecutive weekends. On the first weekend, Scouts distribute bags to let their neighbors know about the drive. On the second, Scouts revisit those houses to pick up bags full of canned food, cereal, pasta, peanut butter, juice and other nonperishable items.

The bags do not have a date on them so units who cannot do the distribution on November 7th and pick up on November 14th may choose their own weekends to do the drive. You are encouraged to try and do your drive on these dates. Pick up bags at the Wehrle Service Center, Huntington Scout Shop or Parkersburg Scout Shop.

## The Vigil Honor

"The Vigil Honor was first bestowed upon E. Urner Goodman by the Unami Lodge in 1915, and has since been conferred annually as a national recognition upon OA members for noteworthy service to others through the OA and Scouting. Lodges nominate candidates for the Vigil Honor, the highest honor that the Order of the Arrow can bestow upon its members for service to lodge, council, and Scouting. Membership cannot be won by a person's conscious endeavors. The Vigil Honor is a high mark of distinction and recognition reserved for those Arrowmen who, by reason of exceptional service, personal effort, and unselfish interest, have made distinguished contributions beyond the immediate responsibilities of their position of office to one or more of the following:

- Lodge
- Order of the Arrow
- Scouting community
- Scout Camp

Under no circumstances should tenure in Scouting or the Order of the Arrow be considered as reason enough for a Vigil Honor recommendation. Any member of the Order of the Arrow registered in Scouting and in good standing in a regularly chartered lodge is eligible for recommendation to the National Order of the Arrow Committee for elevation to the Vigil Honor provided that, at the time of the recommendation, the individual has been a Brotherhood member for a minimum of two years."


