Have you ever heard of elephant toothpaste and dancing raisins? It's Weird Science and Cub Scouts love Weird Science!


The Buckskin Council is excited about Cub Scout Day Camp this year!

The 2022 World Scout Moot is an official event of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM), hosted and organized by Scouting Ireland, for young people from ages 18 through 25. Make plans to join 5,000 participants and 1,000 IST (staff) from 80 countries around the world at the Moot. The new dates for the 16th World Scout Moot will be from 18 to 28 July 2022. Participants will be required to be born on or between 19 July 1995 and 18 July 2004. International Service Team (IST) members must be at least 27 years old on the first day of the Moot (18th July 2022), as such, their date of birth will be the 18th July 1995 or earlier.

What is a "Moot"?

Imagine a high-adventure World Scout Jamboree for young adult Scouts, but on a smaller scale. Learn new cultures and make lasting friendships while participating in a variety of activities designed by the host country. One thing that sets a Moot apart from a Jamboree is that the first half of the program takes place on the trail at sights all around the country.

Base Fees for the Moot

The base fee for the BSA Contingent to the 2022 World Scout Moot includes all activities and meals during the World Scout Moot* and a contingent kit.

Moot Participants \$1,850 IST Member \$1,575

Participants and IST members will be responsible for all air travel and transportation related costs including baggage fees to and from the Moot. Port of Entry/Exit is Dublin International Airport (DUB).

*For participants, base fee covers all meals and activities from official start to end, as determined by host

For IST, base fee includes food and accommodations during required additional days as determined by host

BSA Contingent Kit includes 5 BSA contingent neckerchiefs, 5 BSA contingent patches, personal first-aid kit, international day giveaway items, and contingent "swag" (to be announced).

Optional add-ons for the Moot include Pre and Post Moot Overnights (including food and airport shuttle), tent, additional neckerchiefs/patches/swag, and fees for Add-ons to be announced.

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) June 13-18, 2021



What is NYLT?

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is an exciting, action-packed program designed to provide youth members with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home troops and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others.

The week-long course at Camp Chief Logan in Chapmanville, WV, gives Scouts and Venturers the methods, skills and experience to become better leaders in their units. The course centers around the concepts of what leaders must be, what they must know, and what they must do; with a clear focus on how to accomplish this.

The cost is \$225 per youth, which includes: an NYLT field T-shirt, all meals and all course materials. A \$75 deposit is required. Please register no later than May 14, 2021.

Who can attend?

All eligible Scouts BSA and Venturing youth who wish to improve their leadership skills. To attend the course, you must have a unit leader recommendation.

Scouts: Must be 13 years of age and First Class.

Venturers: Must be 14 and have completed the 8th grade.

Scouts BSA must not be 18 years old and Venturers must not be 21 years old by the last day of the course.

All youth must complete a current BSA Annual Medical Examination (Parts A, B & C)



INTRODUCTION TO OUTDOOR LEADER SKILLS

MAY 14 - 15, 2021 - CAMP ARROWHEAD

What is IOLS? The Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Positions-Specific Training and Varsity Coach Position-Specific Training and provides Scouters with the confidence to take youth into the outdoors.

- ➤ Gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a boy-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead scouts in the out-of-doors. In addition, the teaching methods, activities, and games model the variety of teaching used in effective and engaging Scouting programs.
