
Volunteers are the heart of Scouting and in the Buckskin Council we have a group who quietly serve you by making sure the newsletters and other key communications are pre-

NATIONAL JAMBOREE UPDATE

Contingent registration now open!

July 19-28, 2023 are the dates for the 2023 National Scout Jamboree.

What we know now - The National Scout Jamboree is one of the most memorable experiences for scouts. The theme for this Jamboree is FORWARD. Scouting is progressive, inclusive and moving ahead. Scouting provides its members a path - the destination is their choice. Jamborees are a mountain-top experience!

How old do you have to be to attend the Jamboree as a participant? Minimum of 12 years of age on or before the first day of the Jamboree.

Troops and crews that make up the Council contingent normally consist of 40 people – 36 youth and 4 adults. For the 2023 NSJ adults will not be limited to 4 so that scouts turned 18 since 2021 may attend this Jamboree.

What will you experience? The Jamboree program will include the Summit Experience - Skate Park, BMX, Mountain Biking, Zip Line, Rock Climbing, Challenge Courses, Aquatics, Bows and Barrels, Rafting (all the stuff SBR is known for...). In addition, there will be exhibits and military demonstrations, Leadership Ridge, Challenge Base Camp, Inspiration Point, Service and Impact, Frontier Quest, Shows, WVU Science Behind the Sport, AND MORE!!!

"My Scout has turned 18 since the last Jamboree. Due to the 2021 Jamboree getting cancelled he/she/they did not get to attend. Can he/she/they sign up for 2023 as a participant?" Yes. There is an accommodation for young adult participation up to 21 years of age to attend within a Council Contingent or Jamboree Service Team (JST).

Scouting U Releases Updated Safe Swim Defense Training

In collaboration with the BSA National Aquatics Subcommittee, ScoutingU has released an updated version of "Safe Swim Defense" online training that is also mobile compatible. Since the inception of Scouting, learning to swim and engaging in aquatics activities have been core to the program. Safe Swim Defense training is required for any BSA unit who will participate in swimming activities. This online training ensures that adult leaders are prepared to facilitate safe swimming programs by reviewing the eight points of Safe Swim Defense. To access the updated training, log onto my.Scouting.org and search the catalog in the BSA Learn Center for "Safe Swim Defense". For additional information regarding BSA aquatics programs, please refer to the Guide to Safe Scouting and the BSA's Aquatics Supervision Guide.

FAQs

Does Safe Swim Defense training have to be renewed?

Yes, adults supervising a swimming activity must have completed Safe Swim Defense training within the previous two years.

Do I need to take the new version of Safe Swim Defense training if my current training is not expired?

No, you can complete the updated version of Safe Swim Defense when your current certification expires.

Is Safe Swim Defense training available to take in person?

No, Safe Swim Defense is only available online. It is also mobile compatible.






