

Scouting For Food

When reciting the Scout Oath, a scout promises to **help other people at all times**. By participating in a Scouting for Food program, scouts come a step closer to fulfilling those words.

As Scouts, we know how fortunate we are to have a warm meal every night — whether around the campfire or at the kitchen table. And we know that not everyone is so lucky. That's the genesis of Scouting for Food, the annual food collection drive coordinated by the council. It's another reminder to our local communities that Scouts are here, doing good turns.

Scouting for Food takes place on two consecutive weekends. On the first weekend, Scouts distribute bags to let their neighbors know about the drive. On the second, Scouts revisit those houses to pick up bags full of canned food, cereal, pasta, peanut butter, juice and other nonperishable items.

Units in the Buckskin Council participate in this annual Good Turn every November. Leaders may pick up their bags at the Wehrle Service Center, Huntington Scout Shop or Parkersburg Scout Shop. The bags do not have a date on them so units may choose their own weekends to do the drive. After your Scouts have collected the donations, these items are taken to a food pantry of your choice right in your neighborhood.

DON'T MISS THIS GREAT OPPORTUNITY FOR YOUR SCOUTS!

The H. Bernard Wehrle Sr. Scout Leadership Service Center has a very unique quality that you should be aware of and take advantage of! We have a program activity room that can accommodate 40 or more Scouts and leaders in sleeping bags. The program activity room also has a drop down screen and projector. The Program activity area has a food prep area with microwave ovens, warming bins, commercial grade refrigerator, and ice machine. We have rest rooms with showers. We have a campfire ring outside along the banks of the Kanawha River. There is camping available on

the river, just bring your own camping gear.

Scout units spending the day or weekend will get a pin code to access the program activity area even though the Service Center is closed.

We are a short hike from the State Capitol complex, including the Culture Center and Museum. We have the Craik-Patton House right next door. We have STEM kits so your Scouts can arrange to have a STEM program while using the program activity.

Reservation can be made by contacting the Service Center at 304-340-3663. The cost for Scouts and leaders is a minimal charge of \$2 a person for a day, or \$3 a person for the weekend. Additional cost may be charged if you use expendable supplies for the STEM program.

Best of all, there is a patch for your Scouts if you camp the night at the Wehrle Center!





2023 National Scout Jamboree Sign Up Today!

Hiking, biking, the skate park, paddle boarding, climbing, swimming, cooking, rowing, gatherings, and more! The National Jamboree is an experience you'll talk about your whole life. And it's only 10 months away!

FEES: The Council fee to attend the 2023 NSJ is \$2.115 which you can make in installments. The final payment is due March 15, 2023. We encourage scouts and their families to make regular monthly payments.

Jamboree Scholarships are linked to the National registration site. Scouts may apply for one until December 31st, 2022. Scholarships are need based and may not exceed more than 50% of the NSJ fee, not the additional costs associated with the items the Council is required to provide.

BSA Climbing Level 1 Training

BSA Climbing Level 1 training is for people who are interested in teaching Scouts how to climb and rappel at the Unit, District or Council level. This group might include those interested in becoming Climbing Merit Badge Counselors, Camp Staff and Scouters. Scouters who work with troops and teach climbing are required to be "Qualified Instructors" prior to teaching any climbing / rappelling activities.

DATE: November 4 – 6; 7:00 Friday Evening through 1:00 Sunday Afternoon

LOCATION: Camp Kootaga Lodge

COST: \$45 Cost includes lodging, cracker barrel on Friday evening, continental breakfast on Saturday and Sunday, Saturday lunch and dinner. For those who wish to stay overnight, arrangements can be made for lodging. It is suggested that you eat dinner on Friday evening before arriving.

REGISTRATION: Register at www.buckskin.org

EQUIPMENT: Climbing gear will be provided (ropes, anchors, carabiners, etc.) There is limited sleeping space in the Lodge. You will need to provide your own sleeping bag or linens or your regular gear for a weekend outing if you plan on sleeping in the Adirondacks or your tent.

OVERVIEW: This course is very intense and will work into the late hours of the night. We will cover BSA current National Policies associated with all climbing/rappelling activities, at the Unit, Council and District levels, as outlined in the pamphlet entitled "Climb on Safely," and the National Camp Accreditation Program. Textbook is BSA publication entitled "Belay On" (provided). This course will be conducted over a weekend (starting Friday night). Meals will be provided Saturday and Sunday, but please bring take out or have dinner before you arrive Friday night.

- Current registration with Boy Scouts of America
- At least 18 years old
- Current successful completion of BSA's "Youth Protection Guidelines" training
- Current BSA Annual Health and Medical Record




