Dear Scout volunteers,

October really represents the scouting program in full swing. Cub Scouts have been recruited, Packs and Troops are once again meeting, and opportunities for Scouting FUN are rapidly approaching. Recent studies have revealed that 15% of our Scouts drop out of the program within the first 60 days. I wonder what could happen to discourage a new Cub Scout or Boy Scout so much that they leave the program before they can really start to have fun.

Fun! I think that is the key word. If our newest Scouts don't do anything "fun" in the first sixty days, they quickly become discouraged and disappointed. They have very little invested, so it is easy to just walk away from Scouting. They will never know the ultimate fun they might have enjoyed;

they will never know the life skills, the lessons in citizenship, or the life changing transformation of their character. They may not reach their full potential as adults, and they will probably not strive to involve their children in Scouting.

So what to do? First, make sure that every Scout has a fun Scouting experience in his first sixty days as a Scout. Plan a fun Pack or Troop outing, or take advantage of one of your Districts activities. Check your District page for upcoming events! Make sure every new Scout is invited and attends. If they do, they will stick around long enough to start benefiting from Scouting.

Secondly, every leader that has front line contact with our Scouts should be trained. I have heard many of the reasons why a den leader, cubmaster, or scoutmaster cannot or will not take training. You can pile all those reasons together, and they will pale in comparison when measured against the fact that B.S.A. **trained leaders** consistently deliver a better program to the Scouts. And that's what we should be all about. Delivering the best program to our precious children. Or to put it another way, every Scout deserves a trained leader.

So let us make this our slogan this fall. "Deliver the Promise" to our Scouts; Trained leaders leading Scouts to their first significant Scouting experience within the first sixty days.

2023 National Scout Jamboree Sign Up Today!

Hiking, biking, the skate park, paddle boarding, climbing, swimming, cooking, rowing, gatherings, and more! The National Jamboree is an experience you'll talk about your whole life. And it's only 10 months away!

Don't wait...register now! Early bird pricing ends October 31.

FEES: The current Council fee to attend the 2023 NSJ is \$1,900 which you can make in installments. The final payment is due March 15, 2023. We encourage scouts and their families to make regular monthly payments.

Early bird pricing ends and the fee goes up an additional \$215 on November 1st, so now is the time to register.

Jamboree Scholarships are linked to the National registration site. Scholarships may be applied for from now until December 31st, 2022. Scholarships are need based and may not exceed more than 50% of the NSJ fee, not the additional costs associated with the items the Council is required to provide.

When registering for the Jamboree, please be sure to keep these tips in mind.

- The participant being registered must have his/her own My.Scouting profile. Parents <u>cannot</u> register their scout using the parents' My.Scouting account.
- When creating the scout's My. Scouting profile, be sure to have the scout's current membership number.
- If a parent is entering the registration for their scout, use the scout's username and password for My.Scouting. The Jamboree registration process will populate certain fields on the Jamboree application with information taken from the My.Scouting profile.
- Select a session, which should be "Contingent/Participant Session July 19-28, 2023". Other option will be displayed, but these are for Jamboree Service Team applicants.
- Select an attendee type. "Youth Participant" for youth under 18 yrs.. "Leader" for adults. "Young Adult Participant" should be selected by those 18 - 21 years old who wish to attend as participants.
- Once the application is completed and has no errors, the scout and family should receive an email from the Jamboree registration team. This email has the subject line "2023 National Jamboree Parental Consent ACTION REQUIRED". This is the Disclaimer email which must be acknowledged before the application moves to the Council Review and Approval step. Check your spam email folder as well as your inbox for this email.

Buckskin Council Troops Attended the Circuit Rider 32 Camporee

A total of 312 Scouts and adult Scout leaders attended Circuit Rider 32, a weekend of wholesome activities held Sept. 9-11 at West Virginia University's Jackson's Mill, near Weston.

Ralph Herron, the West Virginia United Methodist Annual Conference's Scout Coordinator, said approximately 400 youth and adult leaders had registered for the event but Covid forced several units to cancel. Because of the pandemic, Circuit Rider was not held in 2020 or 2021.

Circuit Rider activities ranged from mountain bike riding, flytying classes and a session titled "From Life to Eagle," to a workshop titled, "Building the Scout Fire," by Steven Scheid, director of the General Commission on United Methodist Men's Center for Scouting Ministries.

Scouts who chose to participate brought ingredients for household cleaning kits. Scouts gathered Saturday afternoon and assembled just over 100 kits for clients of the Upshur Parish House, the United Methodist Mission in Buckhannon.

There were 18 entries in a Dutch Oven Cook-off that featured a wide range of desserts. Troop 36 of Hurricane, led by Scoutmaster Joshua Miller, won the contest with a cherry cobbler. "Their dish really impressed the judges, who gave them a perfect score — 50 out of 50," said Charles Seccurro of Fairmont, the contest organizer and the Mountaineer Area Council's Heart of West Virginia District Commissioner. The winners received a Dutch oven and a traveling trophy.

Circuit Rider drew Scouts from Ohio and Kentucky as well as West Virginia. The event is hosted by the West Virginia United Methodist Men.

A gathering Saturday evening featured skits by Scouts and music by the New Diesel Trio of Bridgeport. Eagle Scout Ryan Campione served as master of ceremonies.

Twenty seven Scouts completed an introductory class about the Bible taught by Rev. George Webb, pastor of the Humphreys United Methodist Church in Sissonville.

Scouts, adult leaders and the United Methodist Men gathered Sunday morning for a worship service and Holy Communion led by Pastor Greg Godwin, a retired elder in the United Methodist Church's West Virginia Conference. Godwin also is the resident chaplain at the Scout's Summit Bechtel Reserve near Glen Jean. An offering collected during the service raised \$611 for the West Virginia United Methodist Conference Disaster Relief Fund. West Virginia Area Bishop Sandra Steiner Ball explained that the fund is maintained for disaster use inside and outside of the West Virginia Conference. "Right now, due to giving out of the fund for both Kentucky and Tennessee, the West Virginia fund has been depleted from the level we try to maintain for emergencies and needs," she said.

Plans are already underway for the 2023 Circuit Rider, which will be Sept. 8-10 at Jackson's Mill.



Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation

OCTOBER 7-8, 2022 - CAMP KOOTAGA

BALOO is intended for new Cub Scout leaders or parent volunteers who have minimal camping experience but want to plan and carry out entry level outdoor experiences for the pack. The format for this training is an outdoor camping adventure. The course is designed to address a wide variety of topics which need to be considered when preparing for a Cub Scout outdoor activity. Some of the topics include Aims & Purposes, Planning, Campfire, Health & Safety, Equipment, Cooking, program ideas, and more.

Prior to taking the practical component, <u>participants must have completed the online component</u>. Both the online and the practical, must be completed in order to fulfill the "BALOO Trained" status. In the event the online component is not completed prior to the practical, the trained status is withheld until both components are successfully completed. The online portion is available through the BSA LearnCenter. Log onto my.scouting.org and select the BSA LearnCenter image on the right side of the home page. Complete the course entitled "BALOO Prerequisite Training V2"

The next course will be October 7 - 8 at Camp Kootaga. Check-in begins Friday at 6:30pm. All participants are expected to arrive by 7:00pm. The course is planned to conclude by 6:30pm on Saturday.

The course is \$20.00 per person. This covers course material, cracker barrel on Friday night, along with breakfast and lunch on Saturday.
