2023 National Scout Jamboree Sign Up Today!

We are about eight months from the most spectacular Scouting event – the National Scout Jamboree. The dates are July 19-28, 2023. And the place is right here in our backyard – the Summit Bechtel Reserve near Glen Jean, WV.

Program plans for the Jamboree are being finalized and there will be some major announcements regarding entertainment and special visitors at the event.

Thirty-three slots in the Council's male troop contingent have been reserved. There are eight slots in our female patrol that remain available. Scouts are encouraged to apply now for both the troop and the patrol. If more apply than the number of available slots, these will certainly go on a waiting list. But we may also be able to find available slots in some neighboring council contingents as well.

Effective November 1, the fee for the Jamboree increased to \$2,115 as the early registration discount expired. But this once in a lifetime experience is still very much worth the cost to attend.

As spring approaches, the pace of preparation by our contingent will increase. There will be a "shakedown" campout, informational meetings about what to bring and what to leave at home, outlines of the daily schedules, and the development of menus for the in-camp meals.

February 25, 2023 – 10:00am Capitol Complex, Charleston, WV

All Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, and Venture Scouts are invited to a fun and educational day on Saturday, February 25, 2023. Scouts will meet in front of the WV Cultural Center, Building 9, Capitol Complex, 1900 Kanawha Blvd E. The full day of activities begins at 10:00am with a 40-minute walking tour of the statuary and monuments on the complex grounds. This will be followed by a guided tour of the Capitol Building. Then head to the Charleston Service Center for a hot dog lunch. (The H. Bernard Wehrle, Sr.

Scout Leadership Service Center and Scout Shop is located at 2829 Kanawha Blvd E.)

After lunch everyone has an opportunity to tour the state museum at the Cultural Center. This self-paced tour will take you through the 26 rooms with over 600 thousand artifacts on display. Scouts and their families can take their time as they move from one display room to another. The museum tour concludes our scheduled activities for the day.

This is a Council-wide, no fee event open to all Cubs, Scouts BSA, Venture Scouts, and their families. We do ask that you make reservations via the Council website so adequate preparations for the lunch can be made.



Scouting For Food

When reciting the Scout Oath, a scout promises to **help other people at all times**. By participating in a Scouting for

Food program, scouts come a step closer to fulfilling those words.

Scouting for Food takes place on two consecutive weekends. On the first weekend, Scouts distribute bags to let their neighbors know about the drive. On the second, Scouts revisit those houses to pick up bags full of canned food, cereal, pasta, peanut butter, juice and other nonperishable items.

Leaders may pick up their bags at the Wehrle Service Center, Huntington Scout Shop or Parkersburg Scout Shop. The bags do not have a date on them so units may choose their own weekends to do the drive. After your Scouts have collected the donations, these items are taken to a food pantry of your choice right in your neighborhood.


