UNIVERSITY OF SCOUTING IS BACK!!

The largest adult training event in the Buckskin Council returns post-Covid on **March 25, 2023**. West Virginia State University at Institute will again be hosting this event. This is the largest single training event for adult and youth leaders in Buckskin Council! You'll have the opportunity to meet and share ideas with other like-minded friends of scouting throughout the area. A variety of adult training sessions will be available for volunteer leaders and parents to expand their knowledge of Scouting. Some of these sessions will be CPR/AED &

First Aid, Merit Badge Counselor Orientation, Outdoor Cooking, and much more.

More than twenty-five merit badge sessions will be offered for Scouts BSA and Venturing participants. The new Eagle required Citizenship in Society will be offered. All day merit badge sessions will include Emergency Preparedness, First Aid, and Electronics. Other badges will be offered in both the morning or afternoon sessions, while still others will only be offered in either the morning or afternoon only. Register early for best selection. Scouts are expected to complete the pre-requisites listed in the course catalog. Be prepared to participate in the discussions.

The fee is \$15 for Scouts and \$15 for adults. Lunch is included. The First Aid & CPR/AED class is an additional \$45.

Update to BSA's Barriers to Abuse

As part of BSA's ongoing commitment to abuse prevention, the Boy Scouts of America is updating the adult supervision requirements for overnight activities. This update enhances the minimum "two deep leadership" requirements by additionally requiring every adult present on overnight activities to be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America. These adults must submit an adult application and registration fee, undergo a criminal background check, a volunteer screening database check and must complete mandatory Youth Protection training.

A limited exception for parents and legal guardians of Cub Scout youth attending overnight with their children is planned due to the family centric nature of Cub Scouting. All Cub Scout Packs, Scouts BSA Troops, Venturing Crews, Sea Scouting Ships, Exploring Posts, council, and district overnight programs will be required to comply with this update by September 1, 2023. We encourage early adoption prior to the effective date. This updated Barrier to Abuse can be referenced as part of the Guide to Safe Scouting, Youth Protection and Adult Leadership section, Scouting's Barriers to Abuse. Youth Protection and Barriers to Abuse FAQs will be expanded to include additional FAQs as they are developed.

Dear Scouting Volunteer,

An unfortunate fact of our current society is that we spend less and less quality time with the people who are the most important to us—our children. Increasing divorce rates and dual-worker families mean fewer children receive full-time parental supervision. They have fewer positive role models in their lives. In fact, studies show that as our media choices have increased since the early 1980s, our time spent together as families has steadily decreased.

Since the inception of the Boy Scouts of America in 1910, one of our main objectives has been to provide strong role models for youth during their formative years. In years gone by, these people were called neighbors, teachers, and community and religious leaders, as well as Scoutmasters. Today, we call them

mentors.

No matter the name or title, what our youth need are caring adults who are strong role models. Each year, more than a million adults dedicate themselves to the betterment of our nation's youth by volunteering with the Boy Scouts of America in Cub Scouting, Scouts BSA, and Venturing.

However, adults are not the only mentors. The BSA pioneered the concept of peer-to-peer mentoring, or letting youth lead other youth. When older youth lead and plan activities and campouts, younger Scouts learn from their example. Today, that same concept of peer-to-peer mentoring is being used in our nation's schools, as well as Scouting activities.

Too many wrong choices are available for our nation's youth. They desperately need, and want, our guidance to successfully navigate the difficult years of adolescence. Being involved in Scouting and mentoring has a powerful impact in the lives of youth. The bottom line is mentoring improves decision-making, builds confidence, and teaches life lessons. And that is what Scouting has always been about—preparing America's youth for the future.

I would like to thank the volunteers in the Buckskin Council for your mentoring of our future leaders.


The fee for adults is \$15 and includes lunch.

Wood Badge is an advanced leadership training course open to Scouting volunteers and participants ages 18 and older. Leaders from Cub Scouting, Scouts BSA, Venturing, Sea Scouts and Explorers all have something to gain from Wood Badge. The first Wood Badge course ever was held at Gilwell Park in England in 1919. It lasted nearly two weeks, and the participants experienced a course devised by Scouting founder Robert Baden-Powell.

Woodbadge came to the Boy Scouts of America 75 years ago and has been making a difference in the quality of adult leadership ever since. 



Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation May 5-6, 2023 – Camp Arrowhead



BALOO is intended for new Cub Scout leaders or parent volunteers who have minimal camping experience but want to plan and carry out entry level outdoor experiences for the pack. GENERAL INFORMATION

The District Award of Merit is a council award presented by districts in the same manner that the Silver Beaver is a national award presented by councils.

The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level.

The award is made available annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 traditional units or fraction thereof. The district need not present all the awards to which it is entitled each year.

It is not appropriate to nominate a Scouter who has already received this award.

A professional Scouter or other council employee may not receive this award based on employment service. However, a professional Scouter or employee who also serves as a volunteer Scouter may be eligible, based on volunteer service.

REQUIREMENTS

- A nominee must be a registered Scouter.
- 2. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside Scouting, or both.
 - Note: The nature and value of "noteworthy service to youth" may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or it may have been given to a small group over an extended period of time
- Consideration must be given to the nominee's Scouting position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectations of that Scouting position.
- The nominee's attitude toward and cooperation with the district and/or council is to be taken into consideration.
- Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards.

PROCEDURE

- Annually, district chairmen will appoint a temporary special District Award of Merit committee of not more than five persons who will consider all candidates and make recommendations of those to receive the award to the council through the Scout executive.
- The Scout executive will inform the district chairman of those nominations approved by the council committee.
- 3. The following procedure is suggested for such presentation ceremonies:
 - The recipient and spouse should be in attendance at the annual meeting or recognition dinner.
 - A district and/or council officer should explain the award and its significance.
 - Eagle Scouts or Silver Award Venturers should be asked to escort the recipients to a place of honor at the head table or on stage.
 - d. A suitable citation for each recipient should be read indicating what each has done in Scouting.
 - The award (certificate, No. 33719; plaque, No. 17565; and lapel pin, No. 17551) may be presented at this time with appropriate congratulations.
 - f. The only uniform insignia which accompanies this award is an embroidered overhand knot, No. 05013.
 - g. A group picture may be taken for use in neighborhood or community newspapers (district responsibility).
