Adult requirements for 2023 National Scout Jamboree All Jamboree Scoutmasters, First, Second, Third Assistant There is some training specifically for the NSJ which leaders Scoutmasters, Unit Care Provider, and Adult Chaperones and scouts are required to complete. As indicated above, all MUST meet the following requirements:

- All leaders regardless of assigned position MUST be at least 21 years of age by the first day of the Jamboree.
- Be approved by the local council.
- Scoutmaster, First, Second or Third Assistant Scoutmasters MUST currently be serving in any unit leadership position.
- Scoutmaster applicants MUST have completed appropriate Interested volunteers should contact leader specific training.
- All adult leaders MUST have completed Youth Protection Training on or after July 19, 2022.
- All adults must register online through the Jamboree registration system as a "Leader". The council will designate specific leadership or chaperone positions at the time the Jamboree units are assigned.

The Boy Scouts of America (BSA) Announces Confirmation of Plan of Reorganization and Emergence from Chapter 11 Bankruptcy to Equitably Compensate Survivors While Ensuring Scouting Continues Across the Country

The BSA's Plan will successfully establish a compensation fund with the overwhelming support of more than 85% of survivors in the case.

IRVING, TX - April 19, 2023 - Today, the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) emerged from Chapter 11 bankruptcy and fulfills a commitment it made when it commenced its restructuring process in February 2020: to equitably compensate survivors and preserve the mission of Scouting. The courtapproved Plan of Reorganization will establish a Victims Compensation Trust that is currently valued at \$2.4 billion with the opportunity for additional contributions by numerous other parties, including the BSA's insurers that have not yet settled. "This is a significant milestone for the BSA as we emerge from a three-year financial restructuring process with a global resolution approved with overwhelming support of more than 85% of the survivors involved in the case," said Roger Mosby, Chief Scout Executive, President and Chief Executive Officer. "Our hope is that our Plan of Reorganization will bring some measure of peace to survivors of past abuse in Scouting, whose bravery, patience and willingness to share their experiences has moved us beyond words."




