## MARSHALL UNIVERSITY MERIT BADGE COLLEGE UPDATE

The 2024 MUMBC will be on March 9, 2024, rather than the scheduled date on the Council planning calendar. It seems that the campus is hosting a number of academic events during February, which did not leave available dates or space for the merit badge college. The March 9 date was the earliest date that could be reserved for the event.

As a result of the delay in the Marshall University MBC, the Council's annual University of Scouting will be moved to April – the date and location are to be announced. The UoS will continue to be the largest adult training event in the Council as well as a major merit badge college event.

The Marshall course catalog will be published shortly. The Merit Badge Catalog for the University of Scouting has been reviewed and we expect some elimination of duplicate elective merit badges between the two merit badge colleges. A significant number of Eagle Required badges will be offered at each college.

The twelfth point of the Scout Law is "a Scout is Reverent", and fast approaching is that very special time of year, the holiday season. BSA policy and the biggest impediment to units rechartering on time. Also, every adult will need to review the disclosure documentation and sign a background check authorization. If you did not receive the disclosure and authorization information, please contact your local Scout Shop or the Council Service Center. It's good for you, it's good for our Scouts, and it's good for the BSA.

## National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT)

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is a weeklong course at Camp Arrowhead, Ona, WV, that gives Scouts and Venturers the methods, skills and experience to become better leaders in their unit. The course centers around the concepts of what leaders must **be**, what they must **know**, and what they must **do**; with a clear focus on how to accomplish this.

The cost is \$300 per youth, which includes: an NYLT field T-shirt, all meals and all course materials. A \$75 deposit is required. We will only be able to accept 48 participants for this course. Please register no later than June 10, 2024. Late fee will be \$325.00.

#### Who can attend?

- All eligible Scouts BSA and Venturing youth who wish to improve their leadership skills. To attend the course, you must have a unit leader recommendation.
- **Scouts:** Must be 13 or older by June 2024 and First Class, or a member of a Crew, Ship, or Post, must be 14 and have completed the 8th
- Scouts BSA must not be 18 years old and Venturers must not be 21 years old by the last day of the course.



The four areas of improvement are the Bobcat badge, Cub Scout Adventures, Webelos, and Cub Scout Awards.

The changes will take effect officially on June 1, 2024.

#### **UNIT RE-CHARTERING BEGINS**

Now is the time to start thinking about your unit's rechartering. The January, February and March timeframe is when most units in Adena re-charter with the Council. Unit leaders should begin verifying the YPT of their adult leaders and checking to make sure that all youth are properly registered. NOTE - Adults and youth who have joined on or after August 1, 2023, will not renew their membership until a year after their joining date. Youth and adults who were registered in Scouting before August 1, 2023, will renew their membership during the Pack's, Troop's or Crew's rechartering process.

#### SKI DAYS

The Winterplace Ski Dates have been announced for 2024. These dates include Jan 7, Jan 21, Feb 4 and Feb 25. #### Charter Renewal by Christopher Burk

Yes, it's that time again. Time to renew your unit charter. I am sure several of you have heard the news that 2024 will bring a new charter renewal process. Fortunately, the change doesn't go into effect until March 2024. Meaning most Kootaga District units will recharter the same way we did last year. Here is a quick list of key things to remember to make the rechartering process go smoothly. Check the expiration date for every leader's YPT. It may be current now, but the system will flag any leader whose YPT expires before March 1, 2024. Review your roster online to confirm everyone in your unit is listed properly. Especially Scouts or Leaders added during recent recruiting events or Scouts who recently turned 18. Start collecting membership fees. National fees for Youth are \$80 and Adults are \$60.


