




Tudor's/Gino's Cards

Dear Scouters,

Retention is receiving a lot of attention these days. National BSA has started to track this indicator and there is good reason. Retention measures how many Scouts stay in the program from one year to the next. It most directly affects membership growth, but the underlying **cause** of good or bad retention can be found in many areas.

The most obvious reason would seem to be a good quality program. If Scouts are having fun, and their parent's perceive good value in their child participating in Scouting, then they are much more

likely to continue through the next year in Scouting. But there are many, many influencers in the quality of a Scouting program. Trained leaders, robust advancement, exciting outdoor program, weekend camping, long term camping, recognition, good weekly meetings, and quality adult role models are some of the most important ones.

Why is retention important? Because we know for a fact that the longer a youth stays in Scouting, the more positive attributes he or she acquires. Scouts who are in for 5 or more years benefit more from the character development, citizenship training and physical and mental fitness that is Scouting. Also with increased tenure comes a more positive view of Scouting, which helps in recruiting.

Take a little time in your world of Scouting to look at ways to improve the retention of Scouts. Focus on one or more of the above listed influencers that you can help improve in your Cub Scout Pack, Boy Scout Troop, or Venture Crew. The Scouts will benefit from your effort.

New Annual Health and Medical Record

Every few years, the BSA updates its Annual Health and Medical Record (AHMR) after consulting with health care professionals, Scout executives, council and camp health officers and other experts to ensure it is up-to-date and helpful. This was one of those years, meaning a new form is available for everyone to use for 2020. Your AHMR is valid through the end of the 12th month after the date it was administered by your medical provider. For example, if you got your physical on Nov. 3, 2019, it's valid until Nov. 30, 2020.

Next year will be a transition year, so you can use either the old or new form, but everyone in all Scouting programs must use the updated AHMR form starting Jan. 1, 2021. The old form will be obsolete at that date. So, the BSA recommends using the new form on your next physical exam or if you're a new participant in 2020.

Recharter Time is Here for Many Units in the Buckskin Council

Leaders, make sure your recharter goes smoothly by:

- 1. Ensure all the adults in your unit have current Youth Protection training.
- Turn in the Additional Disclosure & Background Check Authorization Form for all leaders.
- 3. Take note of the fee increase for Unit Liability Insurance fees, Youth members, and Adult members.
- Contact your Unit Commissioner, District Commissioner or District Executive for your recharter packet and if you have questions or need help.

Background Rechecks for All Adult Leaders

The BSA will now also perform periodic rechecks of criminal backgrounds to support the continued safety of youth in our programs. Complete the process listed below at your earliest availability to help us continue to provide the safest environment possible for our Scouts and leaders. Please note that these steps must be completed before your 2020 annual registration can be processed. The disclosure forms are in the Appendix section of the electronic Courier. You also will find them on the council website at www.buckskin.org/disclosure.

- * Review the separate disclosure document that is being provided to you separately for your review. It is titled "Background Check Disclosure."
- * Once you have reviewed that, print the separate document titled "Additional Disclosures & Background Check Authorization." Review the additional disclosures on that form, then complete and sign the Authorization using an ink/wet signature. Note: A print signature is required for this document. Electronic signatures will not be accepted.
- * Turn in the signed "Additional Disclosures & Background Check Authorization" form promptly to your unit leader or local council service center.

If you choose to decline the background check, or if you do not complete the Additional Disclosures & Background Check Authorization form and return it to your unit leader or local council service center, your 2020 annual registration will not be processed.

Fee Increase

To ensure we have the resources to fulfill the promise of Scouting despite increasing operating costs, the National Executive Board of the Boy Scouts of America has made the difficult but necessary decision to increase the annual membership fee effective January 1, 2020 to:

- •\$60 for youth members in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouts, (\$5 a month)
- •\$36 for youth members in Exploring, and
- •\$36 for adult members
- •\$60 for unit charter fees

Saturday, March 14, 2020


West Virginia State University, Institute, WV

The Council's annual adult and youth training event – the University of Scouting – will be held Saturday, March 14th at WV State University. At this writing, we are still receiving WVSU faculty volunteering for a variety of merit badges. The course catalog is expected to be available in January.

A wide selection of intermediate training sessions will be offered for adults. These sessions will assist adults in planning, organizing and conducting den and pack meetings, as well as troop and crew events and activities.

Webelos scouts may select up to two of the six electives being offered. Members of troops and crews may select up to two merit badge sessions from a broad range of Eagle required and elective merit badge sessions.

All registered participants will receive lunch in the campus dining hall. Lunch will be conducted in two seating's with the scouts being in the first seating and the adults in the second. National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) A WEEK OF FUN, CHALLENGE, AND ADVENTURE JULY 12th-17th, 2020

What is NYLT?

It is a week-long course at Camp Chief Logan in Chapmanville, WV, that gives Scouts and Venturers the methods, skills and experience to become better leaders in their unit. The course centers around the concepts of what a leader must be, what they must know, and what they must do; with a clear focus on how to accomplish this.

Who can attend?

All eligible Scouts BSA and Venturing youth who wish to improve their leadership skills. To attend the course, you must have a unit leader recommendation.

Requirements

☐ For Scouts BSA, must be at least 13 years old and First Class. Venturers must be 14 and have completed the 8th grade.

☐ Scouts BSA must not be 18 years old and Venturers must not be 21 years old by the last day of the course.

☐ Must have a current BSA Health and Medical Record.

The cost is \$225 per youth, which includes: an NYLT field t-shirt, all meals and all course materials.

A \$75 deposit is required with the registration.

Central Region Program Symposium

The Central Region Program Symposium is March 21, 2020 at the Fred Maytag II Scout Center in Des Moines, Iowa. Annual Health and Medical Record (AMHR)

The BSA has updated its Annual Health and Medical Record.

The new form is available for everyone to use for 2020. Your AHMR is valid through the end of the 12th month after the date it was administered by your medical provider. For example, if you got your physical on Nov. 3, 2019, it's valid until Nov. 30, 2020.

Next year will be a transition year, so you can use either the old or new form, but everyone in all Scouting programs must use the updated AHMR form starting Jan. 1, 2021. The old form will be obsolete at that date. The BSA recommends using the new form on your next physical exam or if you're a new participant in 2020.

You can download the new form at www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/ahmr/) or go to the Resources/Forms page at buck-skin.org. The Annual Health and Medical Record is required for Scouts and adult leaders who want to go on Scouting events, campouts and high-adventure trips.



District Award of Merit Nomination Form - page 2

GENERAL INFORMATION

The District Award of Merit is a council award presented by districts in the same manner that the Silver Beaver is a national award presented by councils.

The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level.

The award is made available annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 traditional units or fraction thereof. The district need not present all the awards to which it is entitled each year.

It is not appropriate to nominate a Scouter who has already received this award.

A professional Scouter or other council employee may not receive this award based on employment service. However, a professional Scouter or employee who also serves as a volunteer Scouter may be eligible, based on volunteer service.

REQUIREMENTS

- A nominee must be a registered Scouter.
- 2. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside Scouting, or both.

Note: The nature and value of "noteworthy service to youth" may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or it may have been given to a small group over an extended period of time.

- Consideration must be given to the nominee's Scouting position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectations of that Scouting position.
- The nominee's attitude toward and cooperation with the district and/or council is to be taken into consideration.
- Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards.

PROCEDURE

- Annually, district chairmen will appoint a temporary special District Award of Merit committee of not more than five persons who
 will consider all candidates and make recommendations of those to receive the award to the council through the Scout executive.
- 2. The Scout executive will inform the district chairman of those nominations approved by the council committee.
- 3. The following procedure is suggested for such presentation ceremonies:
 - The recipient and spouse should be in attendance at the annual meeting or recognition dinner.
 - b. A district and/or council officer should explain the award and its significance.
 - Eagle Scouts or Silver Award Venturers should be asked to escort the recipients to a place of honor at the head table or on stage.
 - d. A suitable citation for each recipient should be read indicating what each has done in Scouting.
 - The award (certificate, No. 33719; plaque, No. 17565; and lapel pin, No. 17551) may be presented at this time with appropriate congratulations.
 - f. The only uniform insignia which accompanies this award is an embroidered overhand knot, No. 05013.
 - g. A group picture may be taken for use in neighborhood or community newspapers (district responsibility).
