MERIT BADGE COLLEGES GO VIRTUAL!

As so many things have been impacted by the pandemic, it is no surprise that the winter merit badge colleges traditionally held at Marshall University in February and at West Virginia State University in March, have been replaced by virtual Online Merit Badge Colleges (OMBC) this year. Plans are underway to present these sessions on the dates these two MBC's would have occurred - February 13 and March 13.

The Council has had very good response to the Online Merit Badge Colleges (OMBC) which have been offered during 2020.

The biggest difference scouts will see in these OMBC's in February and March is the fact we must limit the number of badges being offered. Both sessions will have 9 merit badges in the morning and a different 9 badges in the afternoon. One all-day session badge will be offered during each OMBC. Badges are not being duplicated between OMBC's. Ten Eagle badges will be offered between the two Colleges. One Eagle badge will be an all-day session in each College.

As many scouts in our Council know, there are multiple scout councils offering on-line merit badge sessions. Several of these councils have charged a fee to participate. Buckskin Council has not charged any fees for OMBC participants. And we are grateful to our counselors who have donated countless hours to make these previous OMBC's successful. As a result, we do have a number of out of council scouts who register for our OMBC's when they are offered.

Our point is that once registration opens on the Council website - buckskin.org - Buckskin scouts should register early for the best selection of merit badge and to secure a place in the session. Each merit badge session will be limited to 20 scouts, and again, all 38 badges being offered will only be offered once between the two OMBC's.

OMBC is open to all Scouts, BSA and Venture scouts in the Buckskin Council. Since we have had a number of scouts from outside the council participate in previous OMBC's, many of these scouts monitor our website for information about upcoming OMBC events so they can register for badges. Since each session is limited to 20 participants, our recommendation is to select your badges and register as early as you can.

Youth Protection Training

Have you checked your Youth Protection trained status lately? Most of us renewed our Youth Protection training in 2018 when the new version was released. Since this training expires after two years, many leaders now have expired YPT training. Please take a few minutes to log into your my.scouting.org account and check your status.

Using your computer: Once you log in, click on the "Menu" button then select "My Training". Your Youth Protection status (the date you last took the training) will display at the top. If you need to retake training, just select "Retake Course".

Using your mobile device: Open the "my.Scouting" app which can be downloaded from the Apple Store or Google App Store. Log in and your YPT status is displayed at the top of the Home page. Tap "View YPT" button to see your last completed date and retake the course if needed.

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT)

What is NYLT?

NYLT is a week-long course at Camp Chief Logan in Chapmanville, WV, that gives Scouts and Venturers the methods, skills and experience to become better leaders in their units. The course centers around the concepts of what leaders must **be**, what they must **know**, and what they must **do**; with a clear focus on how to accomplish this.

The cost is \$225 per youth, which includes: an NYLT field T-shirt, all meals and all course materials. A \$75 deposit is required. Please register no later than May 14, 2021.

Who can attend?

All eligible Scouts BSA and Venturing youth who wish to improve their leadership skills. To attend the course, you must have a unit leader recommendation.

Scouts: Must be 13 years of old and First Class. Venturers must be 14 and have completed the 8th grade.

Scouts BSA must not be 18 years old and Venturers must not be 21 years old by the last day of the course.

All youth must complete a current BSA Annual Medical Examination (Parts A, B & C)



GENERAL INFORMATION

The District Award of Merit is a council award presented by districts in the same manner that the Silver Beaver is a national award presented by councils.

The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level.

The award is made available annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 traditional units or fraction thereof. The district need not present all the awards to which it is entitled each year.

It is not appropriate to nominate a Scouter who has already received this award.

A professional Scouter or other council employee may not receive this award based on employment service. However, a professional Scouter or employee who also serves as a volunteer Scouter may be eligible, based on volunteer service.

REQUIREMENTS

- A nominee must be a registered Scouter.
- 2. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside Scouting, or both.
 - Note: The nature and value of "noteworthy service to youth" may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or it may have been given to a small group over an extended period of time.
- Consideration must be given to the nominee's Scouting position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectations of that Scouting position.
- The nominee's attitude toward and cooperation with the district and/or council is to be taken into consideration.
- Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards.

PROCEDURE

- Annually, district chairmen will appoint a temporary special District Award of Merit committee of not more than five persons who
 will consider all candidates and make recommendations of those to receive the award to the council through the Scout executive.
- 2. The Scout executive will inform the district chairman of those nominations approved by the council committee.
- 3. The following procedure is suggested for such presentation ceremonies:
 - a. The recipient and spouse should be in attendance at the annual meeting or recognition dinner.
 - A district and/or council officer should explain the award and its significance.
 - Eagle Scouts or Silver Award Venturers should be asked to escort the recipients to a place of honor at the head table or on stage.
 - d. A suitable citation for each recipient should be read indicating what each has done in Scouting.
 - The award (certificate, No. 33719; plaque, No. 17565; and lapel pin, No. 17551) may be presented at this time with appropriate congratulations.
 - f. The only uniform insignia which accompanies this award is an embroidered overhand knot, No. 05013.
 - g. A group picture may be taken for use in neighborhood or community newspapers (district responsibility).

- Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards
- Order Silver Beaver insignia using the regular Supply order form from the Supply Group distribution center.

RULES AND REGULATIONS of the BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

Article X, Section 6, Clause 3 Silver Beaver Award

The Boy Scouts of America, acting through the National Court of Honor, may award the Silver Beaver for distinguished service to youth upon the following basis and procedure:

- Each local council may process their own annual allotment of Silver Beaver awards and shall send a list of Silver Beaver recipients presented each calendar year to the National Court of Honor no later than January 31 of the following year.
- The award is made for noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth by registered Scouters within the territory under the jurisdiction of a local council.
- c) As evidence of the award there shall be presented: a suitable certificate, duly authenticated by the Boy Scouts of America, pursuant to the action of the National Court of Honor; and a miniature Silver Beaver suspended by a blue, white, and blue ribbon to be worn around the neck.
- d) It shall be a general policy that no public announcements shall be made by the local council in advance of action by the National Court of Honor with reference to names presented for consideration.
- These awards shall be made to the recipients by the local council concerned in connection with its annual meeting or other public location
- f) Each duly chartered local council shall be entitled to one nomination. Councils having more than 60 units shall be entitled to further nominations on the basis of one for each additional 60 units or fraction thereof in their territory, as of December 31 preceding the nomination, according to the records of the national office.
- g) Councils not using their full allotment in any year may accumulate the unused portion for use in any subsequent year.
- h) In extraordinary cases, the Silver Beaver Award may be made by the National Court of Honor to a Scouter upon the recommendation of the duly constituted Scouting authorities having supervision of one or more units of the Boy Scouts of America, located outside of the United States and not under the jurisdiction of a local council.
