Scouting For Food

When reciting the Scout Oath, a scout promises to help other people at all times.

By participating in a Scouting for Food program, scouts come a step closer to fulfilling those words.

As Scouts, we know how fortunate we are to have a warm meal every night — whether around the campfire or at the kitchen table. And we know that not everyone is so lucky. That's the genesis of Scouting for Food, the annual food collection

drive coordinated by the council. It's another reminder to our local communities that Scouts are here, doing good turns.

Scouting for Food takes place on two consecutive weekends. On the first weekend, Scouts distribute bags to let their neighbors know about the drive. On the second, Scouts revisit those houses to pick up bags full of canned food, cereal, pasta, peanut butter, juice and other nonperishable items.

Units in the Buckskin Council participate in this annual Good Turn every November. Leaders may pick up their bags at the Wehrle Service Center, Huntington Scout Shop or Parkersburg Scout Shop. The bags do not have a date on them so units who cannot do the distribution on November 6th and pick up on November 13th may choose their own weekends to do the drive. However, you are encouraged to try and do your drive on these dates.

Wilderness First Aid Training



Being prepared in Scouting often means being ready to render first aid. As we go farther into the backcountry with our units, some additional training is needed. Wilderness first aid (WFA), the next step up from the basic first aid, focuses on teaching assessment skills and using available resources when professional responders may be hours or even days away. It can have a dramatic effect on the outcome of emergencies, injuries, and illnesses. It can mean the difference between life and death. A BSA-led task force developed a WFA doctrine and curriculum specific to the BSA

that teaches best practices to prevent, assess, and treat medical emergencies when in the backcountry— defined as being more than one hour away from definitive medical care.

The BSA WFA course is a 16-hour certification suitable for participants ages 14 and older. The BSA's curriculum includes not only classroom instruction but also a practical hands-on application in the form of practice scenarios. It emphasizes that the safety of everyone involved is paramount, and teaches participants how to gain control of an urgent situation so that resources (people, supplies, etc.) can be utilized appropriately.

Who needs to be WFA-trained? It is recommended that troops or Venturing crews participating in any high adventures, whether through a council or on their own, receive this training. Having more people on a high-adventure trek trained in WFA is always beneficial in the event that an emergency does occur.

Buckskin Council is offering a Wilderness First Aid Course at Camp Arrowhead on November 12-13.

The Fee is \$75 and includes all course materials, lodging, meals, and snacks. Certification is through Emergency Care & Safe-ty Institute (ECSI).

A Message from the Scout Executive



Dear Scouting Family,

The national organization of the BSA continues to work toward the dual imperatives of its financial restructuring: equitably compensate survivors and ensure the future of Scouting's vital mission. We are hopeful that this will be completed soon and we can all focus on our mission and continue to serve youth, families, and communities.

As part of the Boy Scouts of America's financial restructuring, every council in the country including our local council has been asked to help. In the coming weeks, the specific contributions each local council will make to help fund the Trust for survivors will be filed with the Court. These figures were

determined through a combination of information filed in the claims process and what local councils could meaningfully contribute while ensuring Scouting can continue in their areas. Our council participated in this process and our contribution was determined to be \$1,890,782.53.

As many know, the Buckskin Council is legally separate and distinct from the national organization. Our camps, properties, and local donations are controlled by our council. However, we share in the BSA's commitment to equitably compensate survivors of past abuse. Our Council Board has carefully reviewed how we can fund our contribution to the Compensation Trust while ensuring that Scouting can continue to serve youth, families, and communities in the Buckskin Council for generations to come.

Specifically, we have taken steps to fund our contribution by using funds that were acquired through the sales of excess land assets. The Executive Board of the Buckskin Council had hoped to use these funds as a perpetual funding source for Scouting in our service area and it is unfortunate that this will not happen since we believe the best use for these funds is now to help with the resolution of this national BSA restructuring. However, we hope our Scouts, leaders, parents and financial supporters will be relieved to know that virtually no donations made to the Buckskin Council in the past 50 years will be used for the contribution to the compensation fund. It is also a relief to know that the Buckskin Council remains on solid financial grounds. It is anticipated that with the continued support of our many contributors, volunteers, parent and Scouts we will continue to serve youth in the Buckskin Council for many years to come.

It is important to note that the restricted donations we have received over the years can only be used for their designated purposes and are legally protected so that they are used as the donor specified. Donations to our Scoutreach programs and to our endowments can only be used as directed by the donor. Local donations through Friends of Scouting (FOS) go straight to supporting Scouting in our communities today; these donations are used in real time and are critical to maintaining our operations.

There has never been a better time to be a part of Scouting. This fall, we look forward to welcoming new members to our ranks as we "Escape the Great Indoors". A very exciting program has been planned for all new Scouts, as well as our current Scouts. All newly registered or currently registered Scouts can participate in 6 fun, exciting, no charge activities planned for the next six months. Activities like Fun days at camp, Trunk or Treat, Scout Day at the Capital, indoors swimming, Pinewood Derby, the Outdoor Show at the Charleston Coliseum and Convention Center and much, much more! <u>NEW Health Care Professions</u> <u>Merit Badge Coming this Fall</u>

In the Boy Scouts of America, the term "merit badge" is synonymous with fun, hobbies, future careers, and new adventures. BSA's merit badge program was initiated at the very beginning of American Scouting in 1911 with 11 original

merit badges and has continuously grown until today there are 137 merit badge subjects offered in the MB library.

Over the years new subjects have been added while others have been retired, depending on societal changes, technology, and the interests of our Scouts. The current Medicine merit badge is a good example of the upgrading and modernization of the merit badge library. When the Medicine MB was first introduced in 1991, it was primarily developed to focus on the "doctor" side of human health care delivery. At that time, it was considered that the merit badge would be companion to the already existing Dentistry MB and Veterinary Medicine MB.

As the fields of human medicine expanded through specialization, support services, and technology, it became apparent through direction from the field that Scouts were interested in learning about other areas of human health care and medical support. However, because it would have been impossible to develop an individual merit badge for each field of interest in the health care domain, it has been decided to create a single merit badge that will encompass a wide variety of health care careers: the Health Care Professions MB [2021].

Scouts working on the new merit badge will have the opportunity to learn about dozens of health care professions/ vocations, including: Allopathic and Osteopathic physicians; Podiatrists; Chiropractors; Nurse Practitioners; Psychologists; Optometrists; Audiologists; Physician Assistants; Registered Nurses (and other nurses); Pharmacists; EMTs; Physical Therapists; Dietitians; Speech-Language Pathologists; Medical Technologists; Phlebotomists; as well as many others.

As with all merit badges, there will be a merit badge pamphlet containing support text that describes the roles these individuals play in the delivery of health care, the settings where they may work, and any educational and licensing requirements that may be necessary.

The planned release date for the Health Care Professions MB is the fall of 2021, at which time the current Medicine MB will be retired. Scouts currently working on the Medicine MB will be allowed to continue working on it until completed, but after the official release of the Health Care Professions MB, Scouts may not begin working on the superseded Medicine MB. Hard copy editions of the Health Care Professions merit badge pamphlet should also be available in the fall of 2021. The style and design of the merit badge patch will not change between the new Health Care Professions MB and the former Medicine MB.

This ONLY affects renewals with a charter expiration date of December 31, 2021, or later. All other renewals will continue to take place in the current Internet Recharter system (ScoutNet).
