Online Merit Badge College - March 12, 2022

Registration is now open for the March 12th Online Merit Badge College. The college will be conducted using the Zoom online video conferencing system. There is no charge for scouts participating in this merit badge college.

Twelve merit badges will be offered. These include Citizenship in the Community, Citizenship in the World, Citizenship in the Nation, Communications, Family Life, and Personal Management. Additional elective merit badges are also being offered. Each will have a set of pre-requisites which the scout will need to submit to the counselor by Friday, March 11.

Scouts will register via the Council's website. There will be a morning session from 9:00am to noon and an afternoon session from 1:00pm to 4:00pm. <u>All times are Eastern Standard Time</u>. Registration is limited and on a "first come – first served" basis.

Scouts are expected to read the merit badge booklet, complete the pre-requisites and actively participate in the video conference session. "Active participation" means that the scouts who take part will connect to the Zoom Video Conference with their device camera (leave the camera on) and take part in the discussions. In accordance with BSA Youth Protection Practice, all digital communications between the scout and the counselor must include a parent's email address as well.

University of Scouting

The University of Scouting has moved this year to the H. Bernard Wehrle, Sr. Scout Leadership Service Center in Charleston, WV. The date for this in-person training event will be March 12, 2022. Check-in begins at 8:30am with an opening session at 9:15am and the first training sessions beginning at 9:30am. A simple lunch will be provided.

Some of the courses being offered this year include Scouting for Special Needs Youth, Arrow of Light to Scouts BSA Transition, Knots, Lashings, Team Building Games for Troops

and Outdoor Cooking. A facilitator lead Youth Protection Training session will be offered. For those leaders needing to complete or renew their Basic First Aid/AED/CPR certification, an all day course will be offered as well. Participants who registered for the January 8 Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops course are considered registered for this session re-scheduled to March 12. Additional participants are welcome to register for this all-day course as well.

Registration can be made online via the Council website, or at any of the Council Scout Shops in person or via fax, or by mailing your completed registration form and payment to the Charleston Scout Shop. The fee for ILST is \$3.00 per person. The base fee for all other courses is \$5.00 which includes a simple lunch. Those interested in the Basic First Aid/AED/CPR course the fee is \$45.00 per person and includes lunch.


A Message from the Scout Executive


Dear Scout Volunteers and Parents:

NATIONAL JAMBOREE UPDATE

Contingent registration opens soon!

July 19-28, 2023 are the dates for the 2023 National Scout Jamboree. Preliminary information is beginning to be released regarding this adventure.

What we know now - The National Scout Jamboree is one of the most memorable experiences for scouts. The theme for this Jamboree is FORWARD. Scouting is progressive, inclusive and moving ahead. Scouting provides its members a path - the destination is their choice. Jamborees are a mountain-top experience!

How old do you have to be to attend the Jamboree as a participant? Minimum of 12 years of age on or before the first day of the Jamboree.

Troops and crews that make up the Council contingent normally consist of 40 people – 36 youth and 4 adults. For the 2023 NSJ adults will not be limited to 4 so that scouts turned 18 since 2021 may attend this Jamboree.

What will you experience? The Jamboree program will include the Summit Experience - Skate Park, BMX, Mountain Biking, Zip Line, Rock Climbing, Challenge Courses, Aquatics, Bows and Barrels, Rafting (all the stuff SBR is known for...). In addition, there will be exhibits and military demonstrations, Leadership Ridge, Challenge Base Camp, Inspiration Point, Service and Impact, Frontier Quest, Shows, WVU Science Behind the Sport, AND MORE!!!

"My Scout has turned 18 since the last Jamboree. Due to the 2021 Jamboree getting cancelled he/she/they did not get to attend. Can he/she/they sign up for 2023 as a participant?" Yes. There is an accommodation for young adult participation up to 21 years of age to attend within a Council Contingent or Jamboree Service Team (JST).

Hazardous Weather Training

As a direct contact leader, staying current on Hazardous Weather Training is an important part of offering a safe scouting program and needs to be renewed every 2 years.

Remembering when you took it last and when you need to re-new it can be problematic. Like YPT, you will now receive notifications when it is time to retake Hazardous Weather Training.

When notified, you will be instructed to go to https://my.scouting.org/, log in and select the BSA Learn Center. You can quickly access the course in the Learn Center by selecting My Learning and typing "hazardous weather" in the search box. Clicking the "Retake" button will take you to the course so you can "Start Again" and complete it to update your training record in my.scouting. Thank you for all you do in serving youth and keeping scouting safe!

Wilderness First Aid Training

Being prepared in Scouting often means being ready to render first aid. Wilderness first aid (WFA), the next step up from the basic first aid, focuses on teaching assessment skills and using available resources when professional responders may be hours or even days away. The WFA course is a 16-hour certification suitable for participants ages 14 and older. The WFA curriculum includes not only classroom instruction but also a practical hands-on application in the form of practice scenarios. It emphasizes that the safety of everyone involved is paramount, and teaches participants how to gain control of an urgent situation so that resources (people, supplies, etc.) can be utilized appropriately.

Who needs to be WFA-trained? It is recommended that troops or Venturing crews participating in any high adventures, whether through a council or on their own, receive this training. Having more people on a high-adventure trek trained in WFA is always beneficial in the event that an emergency does occur.

Buckskin Council is offering a Wilderness First Aid Course at Camp Kootaga on April 8-9, 2022.

The Fee is \$75 and includes all course materials, lodging, meals, and snacks. Certification is through Emergency Care & Safety Institute (ECSI).

The District Commissioner's Role: The Morale Officer

Having had no past experience with a commissioner or a commissioner's visit, I totally bought into their view. I am here to tell you that I could not been farther from the truth.

I think everyone involved in the Scouting program believes in the values the Oath and Law impart and live up to those ideas so I am going on faith that every unit is following BSA standards and rules. I mean, why would you continue to support a program and put the time and effort in if you don't believe in its core mission?

Therefore the commissioner's job is not to be the correction officer or spy, keeping tabs on things the unit does wrong. The role is to be the morale officer and unit champion. The commissioner is there to commend you on the things you're doing well and get you excited about new and different things to add to your program. Scouts are recognized and rewarded for their accomplishments. Units and their leaders need to be as well. Think of a commissioner's visit as a Scoutmaster's Conference or Board of Review for the unit. "Congratulations on the work you have accomplished. What goals are next on your list? Let's plan on how to achieve them." A commissioner's visit is a time for the unit to share their successes as well as communicate their challenges and additional needs.

In a perfect world every unit would have at least six commissioner visits per year. Considering the Kootaga District currently only has one commissioner, that is currently not happening. Clearly we need more commissions going forward, if you're interested in being a morale officer for the District, please contact me. In the meantime I'm trying to visit as many units as possible but don't hesitate to send me an email or call if you have questions or need some immediate help.



Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts are invited to share in a fun and exciting camping weekend. Scouts will have the opportunity to earn the Castaway elective. Scouts will also participate in the annual Fishing Derby on Saturday morning.

Participation is limited to first and second year Webelos scouts, registered Cub Scout leaders, and parents. Packs are expected to provide leadership to their scouts while in camp. It is expected that a pack will have a ratio of at least one adult for every five scouts, with a minimum of two adults.

This camping event will begin Friday, April 22 and conclude on Sunday, April 24, 2022. Check-in will begin as early as 5:00pm on Friday evening. (No dinner will be provided on Friday night.) The campout will dismiss about 10:00am on Sunday morning. During the weekend, scouts will participate in aluminum foil cooking, BB shooting, Archery, Scavenger Hunt, Fire Building and Shelter Building. Then during our cracker barrel time Saturday evening, we all will get to taste what you and the other packs have prepared.



Trophies will be presented for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each category. All equipment and bait should be provided by the participants. Some camp cane poles and bread for dough balls will be available. There are no awards for adults who wish to fish during this event.

- All Cub Scouts may participate in this event.
- Webelos attending the Webelos-ree that weekend need not register for the Fishing Derby.
 Your registration for the Webelos-ree includes the Fishing Derby.
- All participants should provide their own equipment and bait. A limited number of cane poles are available. Some bread will be provided for "dough balls".
- Lion and Tiger scouts must be accompanied by an adult partner 18 years or older.
- Dens or Packs must provide sufficient adult supervision for their group.
- Since all fishing at Camp Arrowhead is catch and release, it is the responsibility of the Scout
 to have the judges verify his catch before it is returned to the lake.
- Fish caught by an adult and given to the Scout will result in the Scout being disqualified.
- Trophies will be award based on the decision of the judges. The judges' decisions are final.
- Trophies will be presented in two categories Most Fish Caught and Largest Fish Caught.
 Trophies will include a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place.
