There are four ways to succeed with your popcorn sale. The more methods you use, the better results you'll have.

1. Show-n-Sell: Order popcorn early. When the sale begins on September 1st, your unit sells popcorn to customers at a pre-determined location, such as a supermarket, big box store, or a festival. Units that have used this method report great success.

2. Show and Deliver: Scouts visit friends and neighbors with the product and a 'Take Order' form. They can sell the popcorn on hand or take an order, whatever the customer prefers.

3. Take Order: Scouts visit friends, family, and neighbors with the Order Form and take orders that will be delivered later.

4. Online Sale: Friends and family purchase popcorn online and use a special code number the scout supplies. Campmasters ships the popcorn directly to the customer. Shipping is free. Profit from the online sale is then forwarded to the scout's unit.

How do you get started? The first step is completing the 2022 Popcorn Commitment Form. Find it in the appendix of this edition of the Courier or online at www.buckskin.org/popcorn.

The next step is to have your Popcorn Chair and other leaders attend Popcorn Training. At training, your unit will learn what you need to have a successful sale.

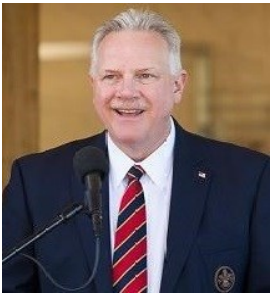


SPECIAL THANKS

--A better four page format (8.5" x 11") that can be printed from home printers AND a two-sided (11"x17") format for larger printers.

-Hyperlinks throughout the document to websites for each faith group that take you directly to the Religious Emblems information. (Some links even directly download the PDF Nomination Forms.)

--More specific age group explanations for each emblem. They now list either B.S.A. program levels, age levels, or grade levels, specific for each emblem. "Senior Scouts" means Venturers, Sea Scouts, and Explorers between 14-20. All of the Protestant Faiths that utilize P.R.A.Y. Emblems are grouped together for their common emblem information. If the specific faith has an extra emblem for unit level youth or adults, those are listed in the Alphabetical Section.

FORWARD to the NATIONAL SCOUT JAMBOREE

Contingent registration now open

July 19-28, 2023 are the dates for the 2023 National Scout Jamboree at the Summit Bechtel Reserve here in West Virginia. The National Scout Jamboree is one of the most memorable experiences for scouts: a mountain-top experience!

The Buckskin Council is sending at least one male troop and one female patrol. The male troop will consist of 40 persons, at least 4 adult leaders and the rest youth participants. The female patrol will consist of 2 adult leaders and the rest youth participants. The youth participants may include those who may have had an opportunity to attend the Jamboree in 2021 but have since aged out of the program.

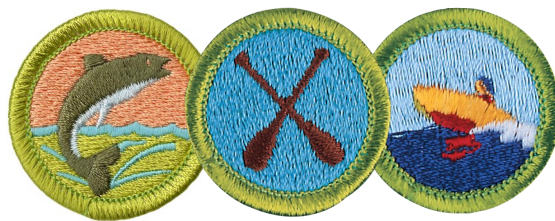
Adults interested in serving as one of the leaders for the Council's contingent are asked to complete and submit a Leadership Application form, which can be found on the Council's Jamboree website. (The form is also included in the electronic version of this month's Courier.) Applications will be reviewed by the Council's Jamboree Committee. Adults selected as contingent leaders will be added to the Council's Jamboree Committee.

What's the first step? Apply online to join the contingent at www.jamboree.scouting.org. Contingent applicants will make their payments to the Council.

The Council's Jamboree Committee is waiting on some additional information from the NSJ before establishing the Council's final fee to attend. The committee hopes to have the fee established very soon.

What will you experience? The Jamboree program will include the Summit Experience - Skate Park, BMX, Mountain Biking, Zip Line, Rock Climbing, Challenge Courses, Aquatics, Bows and Barrels, Rafting (all the stuff SBR is known for...). In addition, there will be exhibits and military demonstrations, Leadership Ridge, Challenge Base Camp, Inspiration Point, Service and Impact, Frontier Quest, Shows, WVU Science Behind the Sport, AND MORE!!!

Aquatics & Nature Camp

Attend Aquatics & Nature Camp August 5-7, 2022, at beautiful Camp Cherokee located on the shore of Yatesville Lake in Louisa, KY.

Aquatics Camp provides Scouts BSA, Venturers, and Sea Scouts an opportunity to complete requirements for rank advancement, merit badges, and other BSA awards. Adult leaders will also find training opportunities.

Scouts may register for up to three (3) sessions, scheduled Saturday morning, Saturday afternoon, and Sunday morning. The registration fee is the same regardless of the number of sessions in which a scout may participate.

Camping on-site for the weekend is available or scouts may commute to the site. Units are responsible for all meals. Adequate time will be allowed in the schedule for units to prepare lunch in camp or leave camp for lunch.

Camp Cherokee is a primitive camping area. There is no running water. Units wishing to camp must bring adequate tentage. Two-deep leadership must be maintained while camping. Venture and Sea Scout units with mixed gender participants must provide male and female leaders as required by BSA standards.

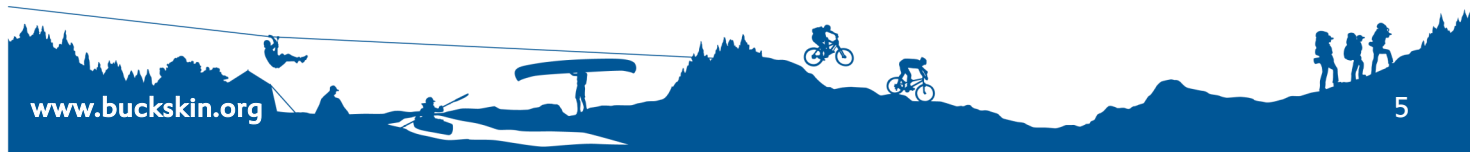
Registration ends Wednesday, August 3, at 5:00 PM. Class "Go-No Go" decisions will be made as early as possible, with final decisions by August 3, 2022. No refunds will be given, but substitution into an open session will be allowed. Some class sizes are limited, so register early to avoid being turned away from your first choices. Scouts may camp with their unit or commute during this camp.

Scouts: Registration is \$15.00 per scout.

Adults: There is no registration fee for adults. Units camping on site must provide two-deep leadership while the unit is in camp. Venturing and Sea Scout units with mixed gender participants must provide male and female leaders as required by BSA standards.

Meals: Units are responsible for their own meals. Be sure to read the Aquatics Camp Catalog so that your unit will **Be Prepared**.

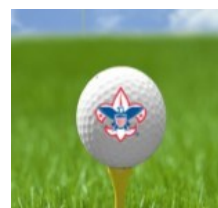

Scouting U Releases Updated Safety Afloat Training

In collaboration with the BSA National Aquatics Subcommittee, Scouting U has released an updated version of “Safety Afloat” online training that is also mobile compatible. Since the inception of Scouting, learning to swim and engaging in aquatics activities such as boating and paddle sports have been core to the program. Safety Afloat training is required for any BSA unit who will participate in boating activities. This online training ensures that adult leaders are prepared to facilitate safe use of canoes, kayaks, rowboats, rafts, floating tubes, sailboats, motorboats (including waterskiing), and other small craft. To access the updated training, log onto my.Scouting.org and search the catalog in the BSA Learn Center for “Safety Afloat”. For additional information regarding BSA aquatics programs, please refer to the Guide to Safe Scouting and the BSA’s Aquatics Supervision Guide.

FAQs

Does Safety Afloat training have to be renewed?

Yes, adults supervising boating activities must have completed Safety Afloat training within the previous two years.

Do I need to take the new version of Safety Afloat training if my current training is not expired?

No, you can complete the updated version of Safety Afloat when your current certification expires.

Is Safety Afloat training available to take in person?

No, Safety Afloat is only available online. It is also mobile compatible.

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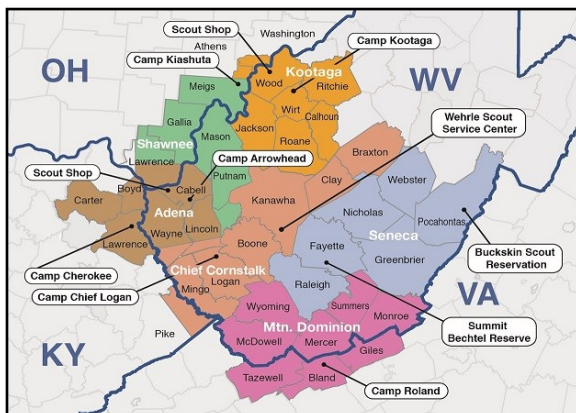

What is IOLS? The Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Positions-Specific Training and Varsity Coach Position-Specific Training, and provides Scouters with the confidence to take youth into the outdoors.

- Hands-on participation is the best learning tool, and this course models the techniques used by effective Scoutmasters, and other leaders in the Scouting program. Attendees will see and experience different aspects of how Scouting works while playing the role of Scouts in a troop.
- Participants will leave the training experience with a full understanding of how the patrol method operates, a feeling of comfort in working with the instructing their Scouts, and an increased level of confidence taking Scouts outdoors safely.

What is covered in IOLS? The course is designed to address a wide variety of topics such as Outdoor Ethics, Cooking, Fire Site Preparation & Building, Campfire Program, Interfaith Worship, Flag Ceremony and more.

What is the cost to attend? The course is \$20.00 per person. This covers course material, cracker barrel on Friday night, along with breakfast and lunch on Saturday.
