All Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, and Venture Scouts are invited to a fun and educational day on Saturday, February 25, 2023. Participants will meet in front of the WV Cultural Center, Building 9, Capitol Complex, 1900 Kanawha Blvd E. The full day of activities will begin at 10:00am with a 40-minute walking tour of the statuary and monuments on the complex grounds, followed by a guided tour of the Capitol Building. The largest adult training event in the Buckskin Council returns post-Covid on March 25, 2023. West Virginia State University at Institute will again be hosting this event. A variety of adult training sessions will be available for volunteer leaders and parents to expand their knowledge of Scouting. Some of these sessions will be CPR/AED & First Aid, Merit Badge Counselor Orientation, Outdoor Cooking, and much more.

Many merit badge sessions will be offered for Scouts BSA and Venturing participants. The new Eagle required Citizenship in Society will be offered. All day merit badge sessions will include Emergency Preparedness, First Aid, and Electronics. Other badges will be offered in both the morning or afternoon sessions, while still others will only be offered in either the morning or afternoon only. Register early for best selection. Scouts are expected to complete the pre-requisites listed in the course catalog. Be prepared to participate in the discussions.

The catalog is still being developed and will be available shortly. The fee for this event has not yet been established.

MARSHALL UNIVERSITY MERIT BADGE COLLEGE

Marshall University Merit Badge College is February 11, 2023. More than forty merit badges will be offered during this day long event. Scouts may register for up to two merit badges being offered. 2023 NATIONAL SCOUT JAMBOREE UPDATE

Congratulations to the 36 young men who have preliminarily been accepted into the Council's Jamboree contingent. Final acceptance will be based on full payment of the Jamboree registration fees, adherence to the Jamboree disclaimers, and any unforeseen personal/family emergency.

A waiting list will be made of any additional male applicants who have an interest in attending the Jamboree. This list will be used to fill any vacancies which may arise between now and the departure of the contingent in July. Names will be taken from the waiting list on a "first come – first served" basis to fill any contingent vacancy.

There remain 8 youth positions for female Scouts BSA members as part of a female patrol. This patrol will be placed with other female scout patrols to create a troop which will attend the Jamboree. At present there would be two female adult positions available as well.

The 2023 National Scout Jamboree will be July 19-28, at the Summit Bechtel Reserve, Glen Jean, WV. The Council fee to attend as of November 1, 2022, is \$2,115. (Scouts who registered and were accepted prior to Nov 1, 2022, will pay \$1,900 due to the early bird discount.) The Council registration fee must be paid in full by March 15, 2023.

Training Corner

Have you checked your Hazardous Weather <u>Training lately?</u>

Robert Baden-Powell, the founder of the Scouting Movement, once said the definition of the Scout motto Be Prepared is this: "A Scout must prepare himself by previous thinking out and practicing how to act on any accident or emergency so that he is never taken by surprise." Baden-Powell also advocated that young men spend a lot of time learning in and about the out-of-doors, as he said, "The open-air is the real objective of Scouting and the key to its success." However, we still need to be aware of our surroundings and their changing conditions, including what is happening with the weather.

The best way leaders can Be Prepared for hazardous weather is to learn how to react before it happens. Hazardous Weather training teaches us how to anticipate and react to bad weather. Knowing when to "go" and when to "go back" are valuable skills for leaders and scouts alike.

Hazardous Weather training expires every two years. If you haven't taken the training lately, go to the BSA Learn Center at my.scouting.org, search for "Hazardous Weather Training" and retake this valuable course.

Your scouts will thank you for it.





GENERAL INFORMATION

The District Award of Merit is a council award presented by districts in the same manner that the Silver Beaver is a national award presented by councils.

The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level.

The award is made available annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 traditional units or fraction thereof. The district need not present all the awards to which it is entitled each year.

It is not appropriate to nominate a Scouter who has already received this award.

A professional Scouter or other council employee may not receive this award based on employment service. However, a professional Scouter or employee who also serves as a volunteer Scouter may be eligible, based on volunteer service.

REQUIREMENTS

- A nominee must be a registered Scouter.
- 2. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside Scouting, or both.
 - Note: The nature and value of "noteworthy service to youth" may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or it may have been given to a small group over an extended period of time.
- Consideration must be given to the nominee's Scouting position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectations of that Scouting position.
- The nominee's attitude toward and cooperation with the district and/or council is to be taken into consideration.
- Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards.

PROCEDURE

- Annually, district chairmen will appoint a temporary special District Award of Merit committee of not more than five persons who will consider all candidates and make recommendations of those to receive the award to the council through the Scout executive.
- 2. The Scout executive will inform the district chairman of those nominations approved by the council committee.
- 3. The following procedure is suggested for such presentation ceremonies:
 - a. The recipient and spouse should be in attendance at the annual meeting or recognition dinner.
 - b. A district and/or council officer should explain the award and its significance.
 - Eagle Scouts or Silver Award Venturers should be asked to escort the recipients to a place of honor at the head table or on stage.
 - d. A suitable citation for each recipient should be read indicating what each has done in Scouting.
 - The award (certificate, No. 33719; plaque, No. 17565; and lapel pin, No. 17551) may be presented at this time with appropriate congratulations.
 - f. The only uniform insignia which accompanies this award is an embroidered overhand knot, No. 05013.
 - g. A group picture may be taken for use in neighborhood or community newspapers (district responsibility).

- Long-established policy limits the award of the Silver Beaver to adults 21 and older who are registered with the Boy Scouts of America as volunteer Scouters.
- Nominations will not be considered for current or former professional Scouters within five (5) years of their leaving employment with the BSA. Other council employees (part time or full time) are eligible to receive the Silver Beaver Award based on their volunteer service, not employed service.
- Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards
- Order Silver Beaver insignia using the regular Supply order form from the Supply Group distribution center

RULES AND REGULATIONS of the BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

Article X, Section 6, Clause 3 Silver Beaver Award

The Boy Scouts of America, acting through the National Court of Honor, may award the Silver Beaver for distinguished service to youth upon the following basis and procedure:

- Each local council may process their own annual allotment of Silver Beaver awards and shall send a list of Silver Beaver recipients presented each calendar year to the National Court of Honor no later than January 31 of the following year.
- The award is made for noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth by registered Scouters within the territory under the jurisdiction of a local council.
- c) As evidence of the award there shall be presented: a suitable certificate, duly authenticated by the Boy Scouts of America, pursuant to the action of the National Court of Honor; and a miniature Silver Beaver suspended by a blue, white, and blue ribbon to be worn around the neck.
- d) It shall be a general policy that no public announcements shall be made by the local council in advance of action by the National Court of Honor with reference to names presented for consideration.
- These awards shall be made to the recipients by the local council concerned in connection with its annual meeting or other public location.
- f) Each duly chartered local council shall be entitled to one nomination. Councils having more than 60 units shall be entitled to further nominations on the basis of one for each additional 60 units or fraction thereof in their territory, as of December 31 preceding the nomination, according to the records of the national office.
- g) Councils not using their full allotment in any year may accumulate the unused portion for use in any subsequent year.
- h) In extraordinary cases, the Silver Beaver Award may be made by the National Court of Honor to a Scouter upon the recommendation of the duly constituted Scouting authorities having supervision of one or more units of the Boy Scouts of America, located outside of the United States and not under the jurisdiction of a local council.
