Popcorn is here to help you fund a fantastic Scouting program in the coming year. With the support of Buckskin Council and CAMP MASTERS, you can earn all the necessary funding through this single activity.

Imagine having secured a spot for every Scout in every activity for the coming year. See the pride your Scouts will have in earning their own way without relying on parents or others for their Scouting adventures.

Make a pledge to your Scouts. Support them in an amazing Scouting experience made possi-

ble by their commitment and hard work. Give them the opportunity to learn new skills, grow relationships within their community and reap the rewards of their efforts. Say YES to participating in the fall popcorn sale! And let us help guide you and them to success.

Camp Masters has brought some new tools and features to help you make selling more fun and collecting payments even easier. They have listened and put together some activity guides that will help Scouts from Tigers through Scouts BSA connect the Popcorn Sale to advancement. They have a payment system integrated now so units don't have to set up a payment processing account to take credit cards at Show 'n Sell and Take order.

There are four ways to succeed with your popcorn sale. The more methods you use, the better results you'll have.

1. Show-n-Sell: Order popcorn early. When the sale begins on September 1st, your unit sells popcorn to customers at a pre-determined location, such as a supermarket, big box store, or a festival. Units that have used this method report great success.

2. Show and Deliver: Scouts visit friends and neighbors with the product and a 'Take Order' form. They can sell the popcorn on hand or take an order, whatever the customer prefers.

3. Take Order: Scouts visit friends, family, and neighbors with the Order Form and take orders that will be delivered later.

4. Online Sale: Friends and family purchase popcorn online and use a special code number the scout supplies. Campmasters ships the popcorn directly to the customer. Shipping is free. Profit from the online sale is then forwarded to the scout's unit.

The Buckskin Council and the West Virginia State Parks have come together to offer camping opportunities for Packs, Troops, and Crews at West Virginia State Parks.

Tent Camping will be free and there are a lot of free and pay to play activities available at Pipestem Resort State Park on the border of Summers and Mercer Counties.

Pipestem Resort has endless adventure activities and is the perfect place for a Scout outing. Campers can enjoy everything from zip line tours to horseback riding to biking and more.

The sprawling 4,050-acre park is located on the border of Summers and Mercer counties and features 82 campsites open year-round, 31 of which are equipped with full hookups. Nineteen sites are electric only.

Annual Membership Fee Update

Beginning August 1, 2023, all new youth and adult members who join Scouting will be enrolled in a 12- month membership cycle and BSA will cease prorating fees. Both youth and adults will pay the full annual membership fee and will renew their membership on the anniversary date of joining Scouting. All proration of membership fees will be eliminated. Each registered member of the BSA will receive an email notice with a registration renewal link beginning 60 days before the anniversary month they joined Scouting. Unit leaders will receive a copy of the email and should stay engaged in the membership renewal process just like rechartering.

Effective **August 1, 2023**, the BSA will implement the following national membership fees which was approved by the National Executive Committee. All fees are good for year.

- \$80/yr for Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouting participants (\$5 increase)
- \$60/yr for all adult volunteers (\$15 increase to provide general liability insurance and enhanced background checks)
- \$25 one-time joining fee** for new program participants in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouting. Does not apply to adults (Not prorated and no change in fee)
- \$25/yr for Merit Badge Counselors (New Fee applies only for Merit Badge Counselors not already registered as leaders)
- \$50/yr for Exploring participants Youth & Adult (\$5 increase)
- \$100/yr for a unit charter/affiliation fee (no change in fee)
- \$15/yr for Scout Life magazine

Key Updates for Charter Renewals

- Units with 2023 expiration dates- No changes, you will renew charter and membership as always.
- Units with February 29, 2024, expiration- Unit will automatically lapse after 1 month. Renew your charter by the end of March. Your unit and members will still have a February 2024 expiration date.
- Units with March-December 2024 expiration dates- You will renew your charter and membership under the new system.

**Buckskin Council will continue to pick up the cost of the New Member fee for newly joining Scouts.

Emergency Preparedness Camporee at The Summit Bechtel Scout Reserve October 6-8, 2023

The Buckskin Council and WVU Medicine - Thomas Hospitals are sponsoring an Emergency Preparedness Camporee. The Emergency Preparedness Weekend will provide a unique opportunity to interact and learn from a variety of first responders from local, state, and federal governmental agencies as well as private sector organizations. This event is designe for all levels of scouting.

The primary day of activities will be on October 7, 2023. Check-in starts at 7:30am and the first session will start at 9:00am. Lunch starts at 12pm (noon) and runs until 1pm. Sessions will run approximately one hour. The last session will end at 5pm.

This will be a great opportunity to learn more about career fields in first response and public safety.

Participants will have the ability to attend multiple sessions during the day. It should be noted that some of the activities might have limited capacity.

Troops and Crews wanting to camp at the Summit on Friday and/or Saturday evening will need to sign-up for camping and will be responsible for providing equipment and food (except Saturday lunch) for their scouts and leaders. Cub Scout Packs are welcome to participate Saturday, however they will not be able to camp.

Potential activities for Friday and Saturday will include tours of the Sustainable Tree House, fishing, and hiking. Details will be provided closer to the event.

If you are new to Scouting, this is a great opportunity to see some of the activities available through the scouting program. Join us at the camporee and learn more about how you can join the Scouting Movement.

Updates to the Guide to Safe Scouting

Effective September 1, 2023

What is the Guide to Safe Scouting?

The Guide to Safe Scouting is the BSA's resource for leaders that contains policies and guidelines for Scouting activities created to keep the youth in the program safe. Find this document at <u>www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/gss/</u>. It is important to use the online version to ensure you have the most current version.

Updated Guidelines, Effective September 1, 2023

Two registered adult leaders 21 years of age or over are required at all Scouting activities, including all meetings. There must be a registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over in every unit serving females. A registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over must be present for any activity involving female youth or female adult program participants.

Notwithstanding the minimum leader requirements, age and program-appropriate supervision must always be provided.

All adults staying overnight in connection with a Scouting activity must be currently registered in an adult fee required position as listed or as an adult program participant. Limited exception below for Cub Scout overnight Programs.

See www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/yp-faqs/ for a

list of adult fee-required positions. Registration as a Merit Badge Counselor does not meet this requirement.

Cub Scout Programs – Overnight Exception: Cub Scout parents or legal guardians taking part in an overnight Cub Scout program with their own child or legal ward are not required to register as leaders. All adults must review the "How to Protect your Children from Child Abuse: A Parent's Guide" that can be found in the front of each Cub Scout Handbook. In addition, the parent or legal guardian must be accompanied by a registered leader at any time they are with youth members other than their own child/ward. All other overnight adults must be currently registered in an adult feerequired position.

Aquatics & Nature Camp Camp Cherokee, Louisa, KY

Aquatics and Nature Camp is returning to Camp Cherokee. Now is your chance to take Kayaking, Fishing, Motorboating and a number of other merit badges that you couldn't squeeze in at Summer Camp. Come just for the merit badges on Saturday or Sunday. Or come and camp for the whole weekend while you earn a couple merit badges.

Scouts are \$15. There is no fee for Adults. Troops must provide their own meals.

Be sure to read the Leader's Guide so you are prepared to have a great time at beautiful Camp Cherokee.

Camp Cherokee is a primitive camp located near Louisa, Kentucky on Yatesville Lake. The Yatesville Lake State Park is a 2,300 acre mountain reservoir located in eastern Kentucky. Built by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the park is managed by the Kentucky Department of Parks. Yatesville Lake is located entirely in Lawrence County, Kentucky, on Blaine Creek; a tributary of the Big Sandy River. It was built under the Flood Control Act of 1965. The dam is rockfill, with a central impervious core and founded on rock. The length of the lake and boatable arms is 20.6 miles upstream from the dam and 18.1 miles upstream from where it flows into the Big Sandy River. The maximum depth of the lake is 60 feet with an average mean depth of 17.7 feet. The shoreline measures 93.9 miles at summer pool level. The lake's watershed is 208 miles. Winter Pool Elevation - 624.0 m.s.l. (1,745 acres) Summer Pool Elevation - 630.0 m.s.l. (2,242 acres) Flood Pool Elevation - 645.0 m.s.l. (3,805 acres).

Directions - From US Route 23, turn on Route 3 West. Go 2.5 miles to Route 1185. Take Route 1185 2.5 miles toward the Marina. Boy Scout Road is on the left as you head toward the Marina. Follow the signs to the camp.

Facilities - There are no showers or running water at the camp. Participants and camping units are encouraged to bring water with them. Showers are located in the state park campground area (will require transportation).

Registration closes August 2nd at 5:00 pm.
