The course catalogs for these two events have been reviewed and compared with the intention of eliminating duplicate elective merit badges between the two merit badge colleges. Thirty-nine merit badges will be offered during this day long event. Among them will be ten Eagle-required merit badges. Scouts may register for up to two merit badges being offered. The fee is \$15 per scout which includes lunch. Adults may purchase an optional lunch ticket for \$10. Select your merit badges or training when registering.

Several adult training classes will be offered at no fee, including Scoutmaster Specific Training, Youth Protection and Merit Badge Counselor Orientation. Basic First Aid, AED and CPR will also be offered. There is a \$45 fee for this all-day session.

Register early for best merit badge selection. Scouts are expected to come prepared with any pre-requisite materials completed. The course catalog has all the details.

Check in begins at 8:00 am at the Memorial Student Center. Lunch for scouts is included in the registration fee. Adults may purchase a lunch ticket. Lunch will be in the Student Center Food Court. Limited menus will be offered at Chick-Fil-A, Steak n Shake, and La Familia

The Horn-faced Mason bee is one of the solitary bees that do not build hives. Native to this area, they are gentle, non -aggressive pollinators and vital to our ecosystem, especially in orchard pollination. By understanding more about these bees, we can help promote biodiversity and ensure the health of our local habitats.

Here's where you come in! WVU is leading a study to better understand these bees and is seeking young citizen scientists like you. You will learn about bee behavior, how to manage their habitats, and contribute real data that will help protect these important pollinators.

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT)

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is a weeklong course at Camp Arrowhead, Ona, WV, that gives Scouts and Venturers the methods, skills and experience to become better leaders in their unit. The cost is \$300 per youth. A \$75 deposit is required at registration. We will only be able to accept 48 participants for this course. Please register no later than June 10, 2024. Late fee is \$325.

Who can attend?

- All eligible Scouts BSA and Venturing youth who wish to improve their leadership skills. To attend the course, you must have a unit leader recommendation.
- **Scouts:** Must be 13 or older by June 2024 and First Class, or a member of a Crew, Ship, or Post, must be 14 and have completed the 8th grade
- Scouts BSA must not be 18 years old and Venturers must not be 21 years old by the last day of the course.

Having had no experience with a commissioner or a commissioner's visit, I totally bought into their view. I am here to tell you that my perception could not been farther from the truth.

I am a strong proponent that everyone in the Scouting program believes in the values the Oath and Law impart and live up to those ideas, so I am going on faith that every unit is following BSA standards and rules. I mean, why would you continue to support a program and put the time and effort in if you don't believe in its core mission?

Therefore, the commissioner's job is not to be the correction officer or spy, keeping tabs on things the unit does wrong. The role is to be the morale officer and unit champion. The commissioner is there to commend you on the things you're doing well and get you excited about new and different things to add to your program. Scouts are recognized and rewarded for their accomplishments. Units and their leaders need to be as well. Think of a commissioner's visit as a Scoutmaster's Conference or Board of Review for the unit. "Congratulations on the work you have accomplished. What goals are next on your list? Let's plan on how to achieve them." A commissioner's visit is a time for the unit to share their successes as well as communicate their challenges and additional needs.

In a perfect world every unit would have at least six commissioner visits per year. Considering the Kootaga District currently only has one commissioner, that is currently not happening. Clearly, we need more commissioners going forward, if you're interested in being a morale officer for the District, please contact me. Going forward I am going to try and visit as many units as possible, but in the meantime, don't hesitate to send me an email or call if you have questions or need some immediate help.





Advancement Updates 2024

As of January 1, 2024, the following changes to Scouts BSA requirements become effective.

Rank Requirements:

There were minor changes to Scout (6), and Star (6).

The Cyberchip has been phased out. Scouts should use the Personal Safety Awareness training at https://www.scouting.org/training/youth-protection/scouts-bsa/ for both Scout and Star ranks.

Eagle Palms:

Scouts BSA will no longer have to wait three months between Eagle Palms. They will have to earn five additional merit badges, and live by the Scout Oath and Law.
