Dear Scouters,

Retention is receiving a lot of attention these days. National BSA track this indicator and there is good reason. Retention measures how many Scouts stay in the program from one year to the next. It most directly affects membership growth, but the underlying **cause** of good or bad retention can be found in many areas.

The most obvious reason would seem to be a good quality program. If Scouts are having fun, and their parent's perceive good value in their child participating in Scouting, then they are much more likely to continue through the next year in Scouting. But there are many, many influencers in the quality of a Scouting program. Trained leaders, robust advancement, exciting outdoor program,

weekend camping, long term camping, recognition, good weekly meetings, and quality adult role models are some of the most important ones.

Why is retention important? Because we know for a fact that the longer a youth stays in Scouting, the more positive attributes he or she acquires. Scouts who are in for 5 or more years benefit more from the character development, citizenship training and physical and mental fitness that is Scouting. Also with increased tenure comes a more positive view of Scouting, which helps in recruiting.

Take a little time in your world of Scouting to look at ways to improve the retention of Scouts. Focus on one or more of the above listed influencers that you can help improve in your Cub Scout Pack, Scouts BSA Troop, or Venture Crew. The Scouts will benefit from your effort.

UNIVERSITY OF SCOUTING MERIT BADGE COLLEGE and ADULT TRAINING MARSHALL UNIVERSITY MERIT BADGE COLLEGE UPDATE

The UoS date has not been confirmed at present. The UoS will continue to be the largest adult training event in the Council as well as a major merit badge college event. As soon as the date is confirmed, we should be able to publish the course catalog.

The 2024 MUMBC will be on March 9, 2024, rather than the scheduled date on the Council planning calendar. It seems that the campus is hosting a number of academic events during February, which did not leave available dates or space for the merit badge college. The March 9 date was the earliest date that could be reserved for the event. The Marshall course catalog will be published shortly.

The course catalogs for these two events have been reviewed and compared with the intention of eliminating duplicate elective merit badges between the two merit badge colleges. A significant number of Eagle Required badges will be offered at each college.

Youth Protection Training

Recharter season is here! Over the next few months, Packs and Troops across the council will be working on renewing their 2023 registrations.

What is one of the biggest issues they will encounter? Leaders with expired Youth Protection Training!

Now is the time for your Pack or Troop leaders to review the YPT status of <u>all</u> registered leaders to make sure everyone has current Youth Protection.

How do you check that? It's easy to check! Just login to your my.scouting.org account and click on the the menu button. Find your unit in the drop-down box and select "YPT Reports" This report lists all the leaders in your unit and their YPT expiration date.

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT)

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is a weeklong course at Camp Arrowhead, Ona, WV, that gives Scouts and Venturers the methods, skills and experience to become better leaders in their unit. The course centers around the concepts of what leaders must **be**, what they must **know**, and what they must **do**; with a clear focus on how to accomplish this.

The cost is \$300 per youth, which includes: an NYLT field T-shirt, all meals and all course materials. A \$75 deposit is required. We will only be able to accept 48 participants for this course. Please register no later than June 10, 2024. Late fee will be \$325.00. Who can attend?

- All eligible Scouts BSA and Venturing youth who wish to improve their leadership skills. To attend the course, you must have a unit leader recommendation.
- Scouts: Must be 13 or older by June 2024 and First Class, or a member of a Crew, Ship, or Post, must be 14 and have completed the 8th grade
- Scouts BSA must not be 18 years old and Venturers must not be 21 years old by the last day of the course.

UNIT RE-CHARTERING BEGINS

Units with charters expiring Jan 31 and Feb 29, may recharter just as they have in prior years. The online re-charter process can be done using My.Scouting. Any of the unit Key 3 members may enter the information. The Committee Chair or Charter Org Rep may approve the charter, accepting the adults listed. Units re-chartering in March will use a slightly different process. More information regarding rechartering after Feb 29 will be detailed soon.

All unit Key 3 members should be reviewing the adults to be registered to verify that each has current YPT, which will prevent the system from completing your unit's re-charter. 1 or later, will not pay any membership fees during your January or February re-charter. These members paid a full year membership fee when they joined.





National Youth Leadership Training July 14 - 19, 2024 Camp Arrowhead

What is NYLT?

It is a week-long course at Camp Arrowhead, Ona, WV, that gives Scouts and Venturers the methods, skills and experience to become better leaders in their unit. The course centers around the concepts of what leader must **be**, what they must **know**, and what they must **do**; with a clear focus on how to accomplish this.

Cooking Arrangements




Klondike Derby Sled Plan
