NYLT and B.S.A Youth Training Continuum

National Youth Leadership Training

(NYLT)

NYLT simulates a month of the life of a troop. It is a six-day course that reinforces and expands upon Be-Know-Do leadership. Scouts learn a number of leadership skills and concepts. They learn about the stages of team development and how to match the most appropriate leadership style with the developmental stage of the individual or team. The course has many challenges for the youths, including its culmination where they undergo a quest for the meaning of leadership, which they then present to the entire NYLT troop.

Eight Key Elements of the NYLT Course

- ***A month in the life of a Troop***
Scouts live and work in an outdoor setting as part of a patrol and experience a month in the life of a troop with patrol leaders' council meetings and planning for the big monthly outing (an outpost overnight trip.) They use the patrol method and rotate leadership positions.
- ***Four Stages of Team Development***
The youth learn that all groups and teams go through four stages of development: Forming, storming, norming and performing. They learn the appropriate leadership style for each of the stages.
- ***Leadership Requires Vision, Goals, Plans***
Through the use of video clips, with the theme of Finding Your Vision/Creating a Future, they learn that "if you can see it, you can be it." Each scout develops his personal vision for what future success looks like.
- ***Toolbox of Leadership Skills***
Youth learn to use the following skills:
 - Vision-Goals-Planning: Creating Future Success
 - SMART Goals-Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, Timely
- Planning and Problem Solving Tool – What, How, When, Who
- Assessment Tool-SSC-Start, Stop, Continue
- Teaching EDGE - Explain, Demonstrate, Guide, Enable
- Leading EDGE – Matching the Leader's Behavior to the Team's Stage
- Valuing People – ROPE – Reach out, Organize, Practice, Experience
- Conflict Resolution Tool – EAR – Express, Address, Resolve
- Ethical Decisions – Right vs. Wrong, Right vs Right, Trivial
- Communication – MaSeR – Message, Sender, Receiver
- ***Consistent Leadership Modeling***
The adults and staff of NYLT are role models who continuously set the example using the NYLT skills for the participants. They work hard to ensure that they use effective communications skills, model EDGE throughout the course, share their own visions with the troop, and demonstrate servant leadership throughout the week. They create a rich learning environment that focuses on the Scouts so that each of the youth comes away from the course with a full learning experience.
- ***Scout Oath and Law***
The course is always centered around the Scout Oath and Law and all of the values of the Scouting program.
- ***Have Fun***
This course is a blast! The youth learn the leadership skills while having a great time.
- ***Traditions***
Many of the past Junior Leadership Training courses' traditions can continue, however, they will be aligned with the spirit of the new NYLT skills and philosophy.

The continuum is a three-phase training experience for youth leaders: Phase 1 begins in the troop with the Senior Patrol Leader and Scoutmaster training youth leaders; Phase 2 is NYLT, conducted by the Council; Phase 3 called NAYLE conducted in a week-long experience at Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico. Few scouts complete Phase 3. The first two phases are available locally.

What Youth May Attend?

A scout must have the following qualifications by the beginning of the course:

- Be 13 years of age or have completed the 7th grade
- Be at least a First Class Scout
- Have the scoutmaster's recommendation to attend

This is a six-day course. It is recommended, but not required, that scoutmasters only recommend scouts who have completed at least one long-term summer camp in order to cut down on homesickness. The course is ideal for Senior Patrol Leaders and Patrol Leaders (and youth that may hold these positions in the future.)

Cost of Course

The cost of the course is \$300 per youth. \$75 per youth is due with the registration. **The entire fee is due by June 10, 2024.** \$325 if registered after June 10, 2024. **Mail the registration form and deposit to Buckskin Council address on the front of this brochure.**

Equipment

A complete equipment list will be mailed to each scout registered. Scouts should plan on bringing their own sleeping bag, ground cloth, rain gear, and tent. A complete Class A uniform is required for each scout. An NYLT T-Shirt will be furnished to each youth to wear when Class A uniforms are not required.
