






Dear Scout Volunteers and Parents:

The course catalogs for these two events have been reviewed and compared with the intention of eliminating duplicate elective merit badges between the two merit badge colleges. Thirty-nine merit badges will be offered during this day long event. Among them will be ten Eagle-required merit badges. Scouts may register for up to two merit badges being offered.



We are inviting <u>every</u> Scout, over one million strong to read their Sacred Texts on this important day.


We encourage Cubs & Scouts to participate in three ways.

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT)

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is a weeklong course at Camp Arrowhead, Ona, WV, that gives Scouts and Venturers the methods, skills and experience to become better leaders in their unit. The cost is \$300 per youth. A \$75 deposit is required at registration. We will only be able to accept 48 participants for this course. Please register no later than June 10, 2024. Late fee is \$325.

Who can attend?

- All eligible Scouts BSA and Venturing youth who wish to improve their leadership skills. To attend the course, you must have a unit leader recommendation.
- Scouts: Must be 13 or older by June 2024 and First Class, or a member of a Crew, Ship, or Post, must be 14 and have completed the 8th grade
- Scouts BSA must not be 18 years old and Venturers must not be 21 years old by the last day of the course.

District Commissioner Message

A Scout Is...

I was gazing at my coffee mug on my desk trying to come up with a topic for this month's newsletter. Many of you would recognize the Friends of Scouting mug with the Scout Oath printed in the middle. Emblazoned in a ribbon across the top are six points of the Scout Law, with the remaining six inscribed across the bottom. That's when it came to me: as supporters of the BSA, we all know what a Scout is and the value the scouting program can bring. But what about the rest of the public? Do they understand what a Scout is?

I continue to hear parents and others comment about what youth are being taught—or not being taught—these days. We can debate whether certain skills are still relevant in today's world, but there is one skill that will always be important, and that is critical thinking. Understanding the *why* is equally as important as understanding the *how*.

If you ask most people what scouting is about, odds are they are going to mention camping and learning to tie knots. Yes, that is true—but those activities have a greater significance than just becoming competent in those specific skills. A rope can be attached to a post with two half-hitches or a clove hitch, but each one functions differently. Understanding the outcome you are trying to achieve and applying the correct tools and methods to accomplish those results are equally as important as knowing how to tie the knot. Untying a bowline is much easier than untying an overhand knot on a bight after they have both been pulled tight.

The mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetime by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law. The twelve points of the Scout Law are specific, but also imprecise. A Scout is trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent—but it is left to the Scout to understand how to be all of those things. And not just while they are a Scout, but for the rest of their life.

In other words, a Scout has not only learned a lifetime of practical skills, but also the ability to apply those skills to an array of different situations. It seems to me that we should remind people that scouting is about a bit more than tying knots and going camping.





Job Summary

The district executive lives in and serves as the manager and operating officer of the district and is responsible for the effective organization, operation, and promotion of the council program within the district. The district executive is responsible for the achievement of district objectives, including the goals. This person will work with volunteer staff to fulfill their functions and facilitate the optimum collaboration between the district and the council. The applicant must have at least a 4-year bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university (transcript with the date degree conferred stated is required for employment).

Essential Duties

- Work with a unit and district level volunteer and other community and business leaders to identify, recruit, train, guide, and inspire them to become involved in youth programs.
- Achieve progress towards specific goals and objectives which include program development through collaborative relationships, volunteer recruitment and training, fundraising, membership recruitment and retention.
- Be responsible for extending programs to religious, civic, fraternal, educational, and other community-based organizations through volunteers.
- Secure adequate financial support for programs in assigned area. Achieve net income and participation objectives for assigned camps and activities.
- Recruit leadership for finance campaign efforts to meet the financial needs of the organization.
- Ensure that all program sites are served through volunteers, regular leader meetings, training events and activities.
- Collaborate with adult volunteers and oversee achievement of training for their respective role.
- Be a good role model and recognize the importance of working relationships with other professionals and volunteers. The executive must have communication skills and be able to explain the program's goals and objectives to the public.
