

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Dear Scouters,

An unfortunate fact of our current society is that we spend less and less quality time with the people who are the most important to us—our children. Increasing divorce rates and dual-worker families mean fewer children receive full-time parental supervision. They have fewer positive role models in their lives. In fact, studies show that as our media choices have increased since the early 1980s, our time spent together as families has steadily decreased.

Since the inception of Scouting America in 1910, one of our main objectives has been to provide strong role models for youth during their formative years. In years gone by, these people were called neighbors, teachers,

and community and religious leaders, as well as Scoutmasters. Today, we call them mentors.

Being involved in Scouting and mentoring has a powerful impact in the lives of youth. The bottom line is mentoring improves decision-making, builds confidence, and teaches life lessons. And that is what Scouting has always been about—preparing America's youth for the future.


<u>Buckskin Council</u> <u>Annual Recognition Dinner</u> March 8, 2025 Christ Church United Methodist

2026 NATIONAL SCOUT JAMBOREE

Hi Scouts and Scouters!

Have you been to a National Jamboree? The National Jamboree is a gathering of scouts and scouters from all over the country and around the world. It is only held every four years and because of that, many scouts only get one opportunity to attend a Jamboree as a youth. Thousands of scouts and scouters describe the National Jamboree as one of the mountaintop experiences of their scouting career.

The Jamboree will be held at the Summit Bechtel Reserve (SBR), July 22 - 31, 2026. The fee for the 2026 jamboree is \$1850. That may sound like a lot, but you have almost 18 months to raise the funds. Many youth cut grass, or wash cars, or shovel snow. Many sell popcorn or nuts. Sometimes groups of scouters work together on a fundraising project like selling Easter flowers or selling mulch in the Spring. There are many, many ways to raise what you need to attend. While that fee may seem high, believe it or not, it is the cheapest ticket to the Jamboree in the country.

Buckskin Council is sending one full male troop and a half female troop. A troop consists of 36 scouts and 4 leaders. A half troop consists of 18 scouts and two leaders. That is a total of 60 scouts and scouters from Buckskin Council

So, what will I do at the Jamboree? Well, you will camp with 15,000 of your closest new friends from around the world. There will be scouts from all 50 states and around 30-40 countries. You will rock climb, skateboard, mountain bike, swim, boat, fish, hike, work on Merit Badges, ride a zipline, learn Mountain Man skills, shoot rifles, pistols, and shotguns, learn archery, and many more activities. There will even be whitewater rafting, though there will be an additional fee for that. Like handicrafts? They'll be there. Like STEM projects? They'll be there. Computers? Yes! There will also be displays from all aspects of industry and society for you to investigate and participate in. Oh, and I almost forgot! You will be engaged in what might be the most popular activity at a Jamboree; Patch Trading. You'll meet friends and trade and collect patches and other items from all over the country and around the world.

The fee is all-inclusive and covers all of the equipment you will need to camp, it covers all of your food, and activities. It covers your transportation to and from the Jamboree, and you will also get a daypack, a duffle, t-shirts, hats, patches, and other items They are all included in your fee, You might want some extra spending money for snacks and the trading post.

So, what do I need to do? Go to Buckskin.org and you will find instructions and a place to register. Do it soon before we fill up. Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS)

May 2-3, 2025 Camp Arrowhead

The Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Positions-Specific Training and Varsity Coach Position-Specific Training and provides Scouters with the skills they need to take youth into the outdoors. IOLS is an outdoor classroom training required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters to be classified as position trained. (If attending Wood Badge, IOLS is required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters)

It gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a scout-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead scouts in the out-ofdoors.

The course is designed to address a wide variety of topics such as Outdoor Ethics, Cooking, Fire Site Preparation & Building, Campfire Program, Interfaith Worship, Flag Ceremony and more.

The course is \$30.00 per person. This covers course material, cracker barrel on Friday night, along with breakfast and lunch on Saturday.

You should bring a Scouts BSA Handbook, a tent, a sleeping bag or blankets, flashlight & batteries, personal items, a notebook and pen or pencil. Dress for the weather – the course goes on rain or shine.

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



Buckskin Council, BSA INTRODUCTION TO OUTDOOR LEADER SKILLS MAY 2 - 3, 2025– CAMP ARROWHEAD

What is IOLS? The Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Positions-Specific Training and Varsity Coach Position-Specific Training and provides Scouters with the skills they need to take youth into the outdoors.

- IOLS is an outdoor classroom training required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters to be classified as position trained. (If attending Wood Badge, IOLS is required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters)
- Gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a boy-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead scouts in the out-of-doors. In addition, the teaching methods, activities, and games model the variety of teaching used in effective and engaging Scouting programs.
- Hands-on participation is the best learning tool, and this course models the techniques used by effective Scoutmasters, and other leaders in the Scouting program. Attendees will see and experience different aspects of how Scouting works while playing the role of Scouts in a troop.
- Participants will leave the training experience with a full understanding of how the patrol method operates, a feeling of comfort in working with the instructing their Scouts, and an increased level of confidence taking Scouts outdoors safely.
