Leader Training is Important to your Scouts

Your pack just had its recruitment night and a bunch of excited, new Cub Scouts joined. You even had some parents agree to become leaders. What a successful night! Now how do you take a bunch of nervous adults with no experience in Scouting and turn them into confident, capable Den Leaders and Committee Members? The short answer is TRAINING!

Common sense tells us that training is important, and research shows the importance of trained leaders. A trained leader is knowledgeable and more confident in the role being performed. Trained leaders impact the quality of programs, leader tenure, youth tenure, safety, and a whole lot more. A trained leader is better prepared to make the Scouting program all it can be!

What does it take to be fully trained?

The first step is Safeguarding Youth Training. (This is the new name for Youth Protection Training.) Every adult must take Safeguarding Youth Training before they can be registered.

The next step is taking the training specific to your position in the pack. Den Leaders must take Den Leader Specific training, Committee Members must take Pack Committee Challenge. These trainings can be taken online or in person.

Every "Direct Contact" leader must also take Hazardous Weather Training. This Course expires every 24 months and must be retaken to keep your training status intact. Hazardous Weather Training is only available in the online Training Center. This course covers hazardous weather conditions that Scouts need to know about and the steps they should take to Be Prepared.

A list of the training required for every position in Scouting can be found at www.buckskin.org/training. Look for "Leader Position Trained Requirements (revised June 2025)"

In-person training

If you are a new leader, the best way to take training is in person. In a classroom setting, so much can be learned through the interaction with trainers and other leaders.

Upcoming in-person training dates: The training is free, but we ask that you register so we can Be Prepared. Both training sessions will be at Forrest Burdette United Methodist Church, 2848 Putnam Ave., Hurricane, WV.

- Sunday, October 19th session Complete the training in one day. The class begins at 2:00 pm.
- Split it up over two nights Tuesday, October 21st and Tuesday, October 28th. Both sessions begin at 6:00 pm. You must attend both nights to complete the training.


Online training

Training can also be taken online in the Training Center. Log into my.scouting.org. If you haven't set up an account, you will be prompted to do that. Select the "My Training" button and it will direct you to the Training Center. The Training Center offers a wealth of training for all leaders. For specific training, find your program (Cub Scouting, Scouts BSA, etc.) then select the position-specific training you need.

Dear Scout volunteers,

October really represents the scouting program in full swing. Cub Scouts have been recruited, Packs and Troops are once again meeting, and opportunities for Scouting FUN are rapidly approaching. Recent studies have revealed that 15% of our Scouts drop out of the program within the first 60 days. I wonder what could happen to discourage a new Cub Scout or Boy Scout so much that they leave the program before they can really start to have fun.

Fun! I think that is the key word. If our newest Scouts don't do anything "fun" in the first sixty days, they quickly become discouraged and disappointed. They have very little invested, so it is easy to just

walk away from Scouting. They will never know the ultimate fun they might have enjoyed; they will never know the life skills, the lessons in citizenship, or the life changing transformation of their character. They may not reach their full potential as adults, and they will probably not strive to involve their children in Scouting.

So what to do? First, make sure that every Scout has a fun Scouting experience in the first sixty days as a Scout. Plan a fun Pack or Troop outing, or take advantage of one of your Districts activities. Check your District page for upcoming events! Make sure every new Scout is invited and attends. If they do, they will stick around long enough to start benefiting from Scouting.

Secondly, every leader that has front line contact with our Scouts should be trained. I have heard many of the reasons why a den leader, cubmaster, or scoutmaster cannot or will not take training. You can pile all those reasons together, and they will pale in comparison when measured against the fact that B.S.A. trained leaders consistently deliver a better program to the Scouts. And that's what we should be all about. Delivering the best program to our precious children. Or to put it another way, every Scout deserves a trained leader.

So let us make this our slogan this fall. "Deliver the Promise" to our Scouts; Trained leaders leading Scouts to their first significant Scouting experience within the first sixty days.

Register Now to Avoid a Fee Increase

Scouts wanting to attend the 2026 National Scout Jamboree should register quickly to avoid the scheduled fee increase effective Nov 3, 2025. The participant's fee increases \$240.

Council Contingent Staff

Councils may register additional adults to serve as Council Contingent Staff for the 2026 National Jamboree. These adults (21 years or older) will play a dual role—supporting Jamboree operations during the day while remaining embedded with their contingent in the evenings. This is a great opportunity for adults who want to contribute to the success of the Jambo- Arrowhead: ree while staying connected to their local youth.

Key Details

Role & Responsibilities: Council Contingent Staff will assist with Jamboree operations for at least 6 of the 7 program days. They'll work with a team lead to determine their schedule and may be required to complete training prior to the event.

Travel & Lodging: These staff members will travel, eat, and camp with their council contingent.

Registration: Register as part of the council contingent under the designation "Council Contingent Staff Member."

Refund & Recognition -

Refund: Upon successful completion of service, each Council Contingent Staff member will receive a \$400 refund, issued to the council for distribution.

Recognition Kit Includes: Two participant patches, Participant neckerchief, Custom 2026 National Jamboree red daypack, A special Staff Gift - distributed onsite.

National Scholarship Program – Round 2

To be eligible for a National scholarship, you must be a Scouts BSA youth (under age 18) or a Venturing / Sea Scouting participant (under age 21). Jamboree staff members are not eligible for a scholarship. Scholarships will only cover a portion of the national Jamboree registration fee and do not include any additional fees required by your local council. Full scholarships will only be given in the most extraordinary scholarships will total less than half the national fee (up to \$780 of the \$1560 fee).

Applications must be completed online by Nov. 30, 2025. Recipients and their councils will be notified of the results: either approved for a certain amount, or not approved. Applicants being notified by mid-Winter.



Den Leader Training Award - awarded to den leaders who complete their training and serve for one year.



Scouter's Training Award - awarded to leaders in all programs who have completed their position specific training plus some

additional training and attained certain performance related goals.



Scouter's Key - awarded to unit leaders who have attained tenure, training, and performance goals.

Basic Adult Leaders Outdoor Orientation (BALOO)

This one-and-a-half day course is required training for Cub Scout leaders who want to take their pack or den camping.

BALOO training consists of an online pre-requisite component in addition to an overnight hands on practical. BSA's Cub Scout level camping policies will be taught along with the discovery of the necessary tools to help units carry out a successful camping experience.

Prior to taking the practical component, <u>participants must have completed the online component</u>. The online portion is available through the BSA LearnCenter. Log onto my.scouting.org and select "My Training" on the home page, then Cub Scouts. Complete the course named "BALOO Prerequisite Training V2". Bring your completion certificate with you.

Completion of this course is mandatory for a MINIMUM OF ONE adult on a Pack overnighter.


