Council Fall Camporee & Family Camp October 3-5, 2025

The Summit Bechtel Reserve (or "The Summit," for short) is a unique Scouting facility spanning over 10,000 acres. One of the reasons Scouting America chose this site for the Summit was its location next to New River Gorge National River. More than 13 miles of the property borders the park, giving Scouts and Scouters access to more than 70,000 acres of managed wilderness beyond the Summit property.

Buckskin Council is having a Cub Scout Family Camp and a Council-wide Camporee

at the Summit. Separate camping and program areas will be set aside for the Cub Scout Family Camp and for the troops and crews who will be participating in the Camporee. Many exciting activities will be available for the participants. These include BB Shooting, Archery, Fishing, and Boating. Ziplining and Climbing will both be available for a additional fee.

Check-in begins Friday evening. Saturday check-in is also offered for those attending just the activity day. Check-out will occur on Sunday.

Fees are dependent on your level of participation.

Event fees

- Weekend of Camping \$20 per person access to all the activities for your scout's age group, 2 nights camping at the Summit and 3 meals on Saturday.
- Saturday only \$8 per person access to all the activities for your scout's age group, no camping, and lunch on Saturday.
- Ziplining \$10 per person (must pre-register, limited number of tickets available) Available for troops and crews only.
- Climbing Wall \$10 per person (must pre-register, limited number of tickets available) Available for Cub Scouts, Troops, and Crews.

Plan to bring your pack, troop or crew to the Summit for this memorable experience.





Council Jamboree Committee Sets Date

for Accepting Out of Council

Registrants

The 2026 National Scout Jamboree will be July 22-31, 2026 at the Summit Bechtel Reserve, Glen

Jean, WV. Registration fees for the upcoming Jamboree must be paid in full by March 31, when the Council must make its final fee payment to National.

Several surrounding councils are not sending contingents to the Jamboree, yet they have scouts who wish to attend the Jamboree. During past Jamborees, Buckskin Council has accepted scouts from out of council to add to its contingent. Due to the relatively low registration fee that Buckskin Council has established, the committee has started receiving inquiries from scouts a National Scholarship, go to the: in neighboring councils about attending as part of our council contingent. There are currently several openings in both the boy troop and the girl half-troop for which the Council is committed

In order to give priority to scouts from Buckskin Council, the committee has decided to give preference to scouts from our council thru the month of September. After October 1, the Buckskin Council Jamboree Committee will begin considering requests from out of council scouts who wish to attend the 2026 NSJ as part of our contingent. The Council Jamboree Committee is committed to having the greatest number of scouts in our Jamboree contingents come from our troops. Scouts who want to attend the 2026 NSJ should register as soon as possible to be assured of having a place in Buckskin Council's Jamboree contingent.

What's the cost to attend? The 2026 NSJ registration fee for Buckskin council scouts is \$1,950. This amount must be paid in full by March 15, 2026. The National Jamboree fee covers the expense of program materials, food, insurance, as well as the use of dining shelters, cot, stoves, fuel, and cooking utensils; in addition to a "participant recognition kit," which includes two participant patches, a neckerchief, and a custom 2026 National Jamboree daypack. The Council provides a 130L duffle, tee-shirt, hat, nameplate, Jamboree Council Shoulder Patch, Jamboree Unit Numeral, tent, a shakedown campout, and transportation to and from the Summit.

NSJ 2026 Scholarships Available

National Scholarship Program

To be eligible for a National scholarship, you must be a Scouts BSA youth (under age 18) or a Venturing / Sea Scouting participant (under age 21).

Scholarships will only cover a portion of the national Jamboree registration fee and do not include any additional fees required by your local council (for travel, etc.). Full scholarships will only be given in the most extraordinary cases; most scholarships will total less than half the national fee (up to \$780 of the \$1560 fee). Applications must be completed online via the National Jamboree website by one of the two deadlines. The first round deadline has passed. The second (final) round deadline is November 30, 2025, with recipients being notified by mid-Winter. To apply for jamboree.scouting.org/ participants/. Then scroll down to the Scholarship Program and click on the Apply Here button.

WV United Methodist Men

The United Methodist Men of the West Virginia Annual Conference have announced that they will provided five (5) \$300 scholarships to scouts from the Buckskin Council. There are two qualifications that scouts must meet.

The first is the scout must first have attended the annual WV Circuit Rider Camp in either 2024 or 2025. (The 2025 camp is the weekend of September 5-7, at Jackson's Mill State 4-H Camp, just outside Weston, WV.)

The second requirement is that the scout submit a minimum 200 word essay on "What I Plan to Learn at the Jamboree".

The deadline for the scholarship entry is January 1, 2026. Recipients will be chosen by January 10, 2026.

Buckskin Council Scholarships

Early in the planning, we expected to purchase tents and generous donors committed to support the purchase. Those needed tents have been provided by another source, so the committee has created a scholarship fund for our scouts to help cover the cost of the Jamboree. We are developing and will soon announce the process to apply for scholarship.

If you wish to support our scouts by donating to the Jamboree Scholarship Fund, please make your designated gift payable to the Buckskin Council and mark Jamboree Scholarship in the memo section of your check. These checks may be mailed to the Council Service Center 2829 Kanawha Blvd, Charleston, WV 25311. Your support of the Jamboree Scholarship Fund is greatly appreciated.

Fall Product Sales and Jamboree

Buckskin Council has agreed for Jamboree participants to have their commission on products sold during the fall product sale applied to their Jamboree registration fee. Participating scouts will be placed into a "Jamboree troop" - Troop 617 - for reporting purposes. These scouts may order popcorn or meat sticks through this Jamboree troop and report their sales by October 29 to the council. The commission from these sales will be credited to the Jamboree fee of the selling scout. Scouts may order product for Show and Sell, as well as doing take orders and online sales. Scouts need to be registered for the Jamboree to participate.

Fall Product Sale

Product sales are more than just a fundraiser; they are a vital part of helping your unit succeed. Each dollar raised supports exciting opportunities like camping trips, leadership training, service projects, and essential program costs. More importantly, product sales teach Scouts valuable life skills: goal setting, communication, responsibility, and perseverance.

Your leadership plays a direct role in shaping each unit's experience. By building a strong sales foundation, you're not just raising funds; you're building confidence, character, and community. Let's make this season the best yet for your Units and Scouts!

There are three ways to sell:

Show & Sell – The Pack or Troop orders Popcorn or Meat Sticks before the sale begins. When the sale begins, your unit can set up a booth and sell that product or check out the product to scouts for them to sell independently. You "Show the product and Sell it" all at once. This is the preferred option with the Country Meats Meat Sticks.

Take Order – Using the brochures from CAMP MAS-TERS and/or Country Meats, scouts can sell to family, friends, and neighbors. They "**Take** the **Order**" by filling out the brochure order form and collecting money up front, then deliver the product later.

Direct Order – Available for popcorn only, scouts can have distant family and friends place orders on popcornordering.com using the scout's unique code. This is called a "Direct Order" because the person can **"Order** for **Direct** delivery" to their door.

What's the first step? Submit your unit's Commitment Form. That tells the council you want to sell. We are here to help you have a great fundraiser.

What is the commission? Units earn 31% profit. You can earn an additional 2% profit by:

- 1. Attending a popcorn training or watch the training video at www.buckskin.org/product-sale.
- 2. Submitting your unit's annual budget and calendar by October 1st.
- 3. Paying for your popcorn and meat sticks by November 14th.

Basic Adult Leaders Outdoor Orientation (BALOO)

This one-and-a-half day course is required training for Cub Scout leaders who want to take their pack or den camping.

BALOO training consists of an online pre-requisite component in addition to an overnight hands on practical. BSA's Cub Scout level camping policies will be taught along with the discovery of the necessary tools to help units carry out a successful camping experience.

Prior to taking the practical component, <u>participants must have completed the online component</u>. The online portion is available through the BSA LearnCenter. Log onto my.scouting.org and select "My Training" on the home page, then Cub Scouts. Complete the course named "BALOO Prerequisite Training V2". Bring your completion certificate with you.

Completion of this course is mandatory for a MINIMUM OF ONE adult on a Pack overnighter.

Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS)

Sept 19-20, 2025 Camp Arrowhead

The Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Positions-Specific Training and Varsity Coach Position-Specific Training and provides Scouters with the skills they need to take youth into the outdoors.

IOLS is an outdoor classroom training required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters to be classified as position trained. (If attending Wood Badge, IOLS is required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters)

It gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a scout-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead scouts in the out-of-doors.

The course is designed to address a wide variety of topics such as Outdoor Ethics, Cooking, Fire Site Preparation & Building, Campfire Program, Interfaith Worship, Flag Ceremony and more.

The course is \$30.00 per person. This covers course material, cracker barrel on Friday night, along with breakfast and lunch on Saturday.

You should bring a Scouts BSA Handbook, a tent, a sleeping bag or blankets, flashlight & batteries, personal items, a notebook and pen or pencil. Dress for the weather – the course goes on rain or shine.

ROCKET LAUNCH FUN DAY



One of the reasons Scouting America chose this site for the Summit was its adjacency to New River Gorge National River. More than 13 miles of the property borders the park, giving Scouts and Scouters access to more than 70,000 acres of managed wilderness beyond the Summit property.

Planning is underway for a Cub Scout Family Camp and a Council-wide Camporee at the Summit. Separate camping and program areas will be set aside for the Family Camp and for the troops and crews who will be participating in the Camporee. Final program activities are still being developed for each event.

INTRODUCTION TO OUTDOOR LEADER SKILLS

SEPTEMBER 19 & 20, 2025— CAMP ARROWHEAD

What is IOLS? The Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Positions-Specific Training and Varsity Coach Position-Specific Training and provides Scouters with the to take youth into the outdoors.

- IOLS is an outdoor classroom training required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters to be classified as position trained. (If attending Wood Badge, IOLS is required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters)
- Gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a boy-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead scouts in the out-of-doors. In addition, the teaching methods, activities, and games model the variety of teaching used in effective and engaging Scouting programs.
- Hands-on participation is the best learning tool, and this course models the techniques used by effective Scoutmasters, and other leaders in the Scouting program. Attendees will see and experience different aspects of how Scouting works while playing the role of Scouts in a troop.
- Participants will leave the training experience with a full understanding of how the patrol method operates, a feeling of comfort in working with the instructing their Scouts, and an increased level of confidence taking Scouts outdoors safely.

What is covered in IOLS? The course is designed to address a wide variety of topics such as Outdoor Ethics, Cooking, Fire Site Preparation & Building, Campfire Program, Interfaith Worship, Flag Ceremony and more.

What is the cost to attend? The course is \$30.00 per person. This covers course material, cracker barrel on Friday night, along with breakfast and lunch on Saturday.

When is IOLS training? The next course will be September 19 & 20, 2025 at Camp Arrowhead. Check-in begins Friday at 6:00 pm. All participants are expected to arrive by 7:00pm. The course is planned to conclude by 5:00 pm on Saturday.

Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation October 24-25, 2025 – Camp Arrowhead

BALOO is intended for new Cub Scout leaders or parent volunteers who have minimal camping experience but want to plan and carry out entry level outdoor experiences for the pack. The format for this training is an outdoor camping adventure. The course is designed to address a wide variety of topics which need to be considered when preparing for a Cub Scout outdoor activity. Some of the topics include Aims & Purposes, Planning, Campfire, Health & Safety, Equipment, Cooking, program ideas, and more.

Prior to taking the practical component, <u>participants must have completed the online component</u>. Both the online and the practical, must be completed in order to fulfill the "BALOO Trained" status. In the event the online component is not completed prior to the practical, the trained status is withheld until both components are successfully completed. The online portion is available through the BSA LearnCenter. Log onto my.scouting.org and select "My Training" on the home page, then Cub Scouts. Complete the course named "BALOO Prerequisite Training V2". Bring your completion certificate with you.

The next course will be October 24-25 at Camp Arrowhead. Check-in begins Friday at 6:30pm. All participants are expected to arrive by 7:00pm. The course is planned to conclude by 6:30pm on Saturday.
