Also, every adult will need to review the disclosure documentation and sign a background check authorization. If you did not receive the disclosure and authorization information, please contact your local Scout Shop or the Council Service Center. National Jamboree Participants Special Fall Product Sale Opportunity

Scouts registered to attend next year's National Jamboree as part of the Council's contingent are eligible to continue selling product as a member of the Jamboree unit. They will earn a higher commission, which will go directly toward their balance for the Jamboree. Starting 10/31, these Scouts will be added to "Troop 617" in the Camp Masters system and be removed from their home troops to ensure the sales they make moving forward earn them the appropriate commission. Country Meats sales are still only made via the paper order form, but the commission is the same amount for both companies. Sales must be made using a new order form or the links generated by Camp Masters for the new unit. Do not use partially filled forms from the first leg of the sale.

Jamboree Scouts can sell Camp Masters product until December 1st, with orders being due to the Council by 5 pm December 2nd. They can continue to sell Country Meats product up until March 27, 2026. To keep better track of sales and payments collected, we are implementing a few deadlines throughout the extended sale. The first deadline will be December 2nd just like the second-chance popcorn sale. The other deadlines are December 29th, January 26th, February 23rd, and March 27th. Orders are due to the Council by 5 pm each of those days. Their Jamboree fee is due in full March 31st, and the final deadline of March 27th gives the Council a couple of days to apply their commissions to their balance. The sale deadlines for the Jamboree contingent are separate from the rest of the Spring Sale.

The Council needs unit leaders to assist with tracking Show and Sell inventory loaned to the Scouts. At each deadline, the Council will need payment for any sales made since the previous deadline. The inventory sheet given to each Scout that takes product should be updated to reflect the sales made. The Council needs the updated counts of product each Scout should still have based on the sales made and payment received. Product that is unaccounted for is the responsibility of the Scout.


UNIVERSITY OF SCOUTING

GENERAL INFORMATION

The District Award of Merit is a council award presented by districts in the same manner that the Silver Beaver is a national award presented by councils.

The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level.

The award is made available annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 traditional units or fraction thereof. The district need not present all the awards to which it is entitled each year.

It is not appropriate to nominate a Scouter who has already received this award.

A professional Scouter or other council employee may not receive this award based on employment service. However, a professional Scouter or employee who also serves as a volunteer Scouter may be eligible, based on volunteer service.

REQUIREMENTS

- A nominee must be a registered Scouter.
- 2. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside Scouting, or both.

Note: The nature and value of "noteworthy service to youth" may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or it may have been given to a small group over an extended period of time.

- Consideration must be given to the nominee's Scouting position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectations of that Scouting position.
- 4. The nominee's attitude toward and cooperation with the district and/or council is to be taken into consideration.
- Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards.

PROCEDURE

- Annually, district chairmen will appoint a temporary special District Award of Merit committee of not more than five persons who
 will consider all candidates and make recommendations of those to receive the award to the council through the Scout executive.
- 2. The Scout executive will inform the district chairman of those nominations approved by the council committee.
- 3. The following procedure is suggested for such presentation ceremonies:
 - a. The recipient and spouse should be in attendance at the annual meeting or recognition dinner.
 - b. A district and/or council officer should explain the award and its significance.
 - Eagle Scouts or Silver Award Venturers should be asked to escort the recipients to a place of honor at the head table or on stage.
 - d. A suitable citation for each recipient should be read indicating what each has done in Scouting.
 - The award (certificate, No. 33719; plaque, No. 17565; and lapel pin, No. 17551) may be presented at this time with appropriate congratulations.
 - The only uniform insignia which accompanies this award is an embroidered overhand knot, No. 05013.
 - g. A group picture may be taken for use in neighborhood or community newspapers (district responsibility).

RULES AND REGULATIONS of the BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

Article X, Section 6, Clause 3
Silver Beaver Award

The Boy Scouts of America, acting through the National Court of Honor, may award the Silver Beaver for distinguished service to youth upon the following basis and procedure:

- a) Each local council may process their own annual allotment of Silver Beaver awards and shall send a list of Silver Beaver recipients presented each calendar year to the National Court of Honor no later than January 31 of the following year.
- The award is made for noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth by registered Scouters within the territory under the jurisdiction of a local council.
- c) As evidence of the award there shall be presented: a suitable certificate, duly authenticated by the Boy Scouts of America, pursuant to the action of the National Court of Honor; and a miniature Silver Beaver suspended by a blue, white, and blue ribbon to be worn around the neck.
- d) It shall be a general policy that no public announcements shall be made by the local council in advance of action by the National Court of Honor with reference to names presented for consideration.
- These awards shall be made to the recipients by the local council concerned in connection with its annual meeting or other public location.
- f) Each duly chartered local council shall be entitled to one nomination. Councils having more than 60 units shall be entitled to further nominations on the basis of one for each additional 60 units or fraction thereof in their territory, as of December 31 preceding the nomination, according to the records of the national office.
- g) Councils not using their full allotment in any year may accumulate the unused portion for use in any subsequent year.
- h) In extraordinary cases, the Silver Beaver Award may be made by the National Court of Honor to a Scouter upon the recommendation of the duly constituted Scouting authorities having supervision of one or more units of the Boy Scouts of America, located outside of the United States and not under the jurisdiction of a local council.
