Only Five Openings Left!

We have only five slots left on the 2026 National Scout Jamboree Contingent! 27 Scouts have registered as of this writing. The additional 7 Scouts, boys or girls, must be age 12 by start and no more than age 17 on the last day, July 31st. We are sending a single family unit of boys and girls. Full payment is due by March 15, 2026. Register today at www.buckskin.org for this once in a lifetime experience.

For those scouts and families who may be “sitting on the fence” in making the decision to go to Jamboree or not, we have some good news to share. A local foundation has agreed to provide Buckskin Council youth with a \$500 grant. This grant will be applied to the Jamboree registration fee in March, 2026 when the balance of the registration fee must be paid. In effect, this grant reduces the Council’s Jamboree fee to \$1,450, but Scouts need to register now to take advantage of this grant.

Council Contingent Staff Welcome

Adults who wish to attend the Jamboree with the council contingent may register as Council Contingent Staff. If interested, an adult should review the list of Jamboree staff posi-

tions at <https://jamboree.scouting.org/wp-content/uploads/sites/6/2025/02/General-Interest-Job-Catalog-2.19.25.pdf>. Follow the process outlined in the listing. CCS personnel are expected to work 6 of the 7 program days during the Jamboree. CCS personnel will travel, camp, and eat with the council contingent. CCS participants will receive all the Jamboree “bling” that both the youth and the NSJ staff receive. After the Jamboree, the Council will receive a \$400 refund for each CCS person completing their six work day requirement. The Council will pass this refund along to the CCS member.

One of the largest single day Scouting events in the Council, MUMBC attracts scouts not just from Buckskin Council, but from surrounding councils as well. How many merit badges will be offered? AVIATION MERIT BADGE DAY

Buckskin Council is partnering with the Marshall University Aviation Department to offer an Aviation Merit Badge Day at the Marshall University Bill Noe Flight School at Yeager Airport in Charleston, WV.

The Merit Badge Day is Saturday, March 7, 2026. Check-in begins at 9:00am. The session will run from 9:30am to 1:00pm. The session is limited to 30 scouts.

All Aviation Merit Badge Requirements will be covered by the instructors, but scouts will be expected to complete requirement 5 as a pre-requisite for the session.

Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS)

May 1-2, 2026

Camp Arrowhead

The Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Positions-Specific Training and Varsity Coach Position-Specific Training and provides Scouters with the skills they need to take youth into the outdoors.

IOLS is an outdoor classroom training required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters to be classified as position trained. It gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a scout-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead scouts in the out-of-doors.

The course is designed to address a wide variety of topics such as Outdoor Ethics, Cooking, Fire Site Preparation & Building, Campfire Program, Interfaith Worship, Flag Ceremony and more.

The course is \$30.00 per person. This covers course material, cracker barrel on Friday night, along with breakfast and lunch on Saturday.

You should bring a Scouts BSA Handbook, a tent, a sleeping bag or blankets, flashlight & batteries, personal items, a notebook and pen or pencil. Dress for the weather – the course goes on rain or shine.

Just a quick note to let you know the local Scout Shops and the Council Service center will be closed for President's Day (Feb 16), Good Friday (Apr 3) and Memorial Day (May 25).

UNIT RE-CHARTERING BEGINS

If your unit needs assistance in rechartering this year, please contact Carl at the 304-523-3408 or via his email carl.sullivan@scouting.org . Unit leaders need to consider that Unit Rechartering is now separate from membership renewals. Leaders need to renew unit charters prior to the current charter period ends. Scouts and leaders need to renew their membership before their current membership expires. These dates may not be the same. When preparing to recharter the Pack, Troop or Crew, unit leaders need to verify that the registered adults in the roster are up-to-date on the Safeguarding Youth Training. If there are registered adults without a current SYT certificate, these adults will not be re-registered with the unit. This may result in the unit not having enough required adults registered in order for the unit to complete its rechartering. Avoid the issue. Check the SYT status of your registered adults.

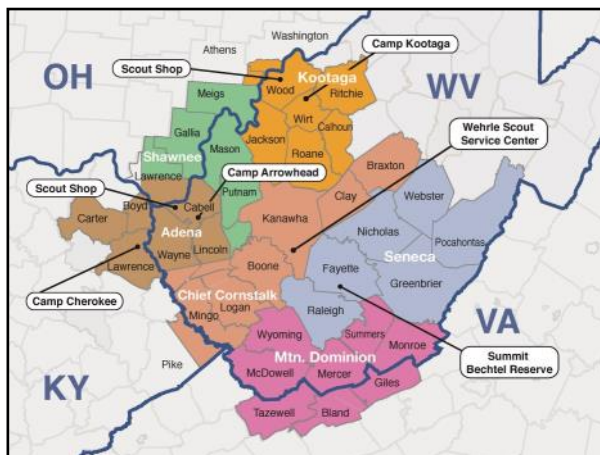

MAY 1 & 2, 2026— CAMP ARROWHEAD

What is IOLS? The Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Positions-Specific Training and Varsity Coach Position-Specific Training and provides Scouters with the to take youth into the outdoors.

- IOLS is an outdoor classroom training required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters to be classified as position trained. (If attending Wood Badge, IOLS is required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters)
- Gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a boy-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead scouts in the out-of-doors. In addition, the teaching methods, activities, and games model the variety of teaching used in effective and engaging Scouting programs.
- Hands-on participation is the best learning tool, and this course models the techniques used by effective Scoutmasters, and other leaders in the Scouting program. Attendees will see and experience different aspects of how Scouting works while playing the role of Scouts in a troop.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The District Award of Merit is a council award presented by districts in the same manner that the Silver Beaver is a national award presented by councils.

The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level.

The award is made available annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 traditional units or fraction thereof. The district need not present all the awards to which it is entitled each year.

It is not appropriate to nominate a Scouter who has already received this award.

A professional Scouter or other council employee may not receive this award based on employment service. However, a professional Scouter or employee who also serves as a volunteer Scouter may be eligible, based on *volunteer* service.

REQUIREMENTS

1. A nominee must be a registered Scouter.
2. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside Scouting, or both.
Note: The nature and value of "noteworthy service to youth" may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or it may have been given to a small group over an extended period of time.
3. Consideration must be given to the nominee's Scouting position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectations of that Scouting position.
4. The nominee's attitude toward and cooperation with the district and/or council is to be taken into consideration.
5. Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards.

PROCEDURE

1. Annually, district chairmen will appoint a temporary special District Award of Merit committee of not more than five persons who will consider all candidates and make recommendations of those to receive the award to the council through the Scout executive.
2. The Scout executive will inform the district chairman of those nominations approved by the council committee.
3. The following procedure is suggested for such presentation ceremonies:
 - a. The recipient and spouse should be in attendance at the annual meeting or recognition dinner.
 - b. A district and/or council officer should explain the award and its significance.
 - c. Eagle Scouts or Silver Award Venturers should be asked to escort the recipients to a place of honor at the head table or on stage.
 - d. A suitable citation for each recipient should be read indicating what each has done in Scouting.
 - e. The award (certificate, No. 33719; plaque, No. 17565; and lapel pin, No. 17551) may be presented at this time with appropriate congratulations.
 - f. The only uniform insignia which accompanies this award is an embroidered overhand knot, No. 05013.
 - g. A group picture may be taken for use in neighborhood or community newspapers (district responsibility).

RULES AND REGULATIONS of the BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

Article X, Section 6, Clause 3 Silver Beaver Award

The Boy Scouts of America, acting through the National Court of Honor, may award the Silver Beaver for distinguished service to youth upon the following basis and procedure:

- a) Each local council may process their own annual allotment of Silver Beaver awards and shall send a list of Silver Beaver recipients presented each calendar year to the National Court of Honor no later than January 31 of the following year.
- b) The award is made for noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth by registered Scouters within the territory under the jurisdiction of a local council.
- c) As evidence of the award there shall be presented: a suitable certificate, duly authenticated by the Boy Scouts of America, pursuant to the action of the National Court of Honor; and a miniature Silver Beaver suspended by a blue, white, and blue ribbon to be worn around the neck.
- d) It shall be a general policy that no public announcements shall be made by the local council in advance of action by the National Court of Honor with reference to names presented for consideration.
- e) These awards shall be made to the recipients by the local council concerned in connection with its annual meeting or other public location.
- f) Each duly chartered local council shall be entitled to one nomination. Councils having more than 60 units shall be entitled to further nominations on the basis of one for each additional 60 units or fraction thereof in their territory, as of December 31 preceding the nomination, according to the records of the national office.
- g) Councils not using their full allotment in any year may accumulate the unused portion for use in any subsequent year.
- h) In extraordinary cases, the Silver Beaver Award may be made by the National Court of Honor to a Scouter upon the recommendation of the duly constituted Scouting authorities having supervision of one or more units of the Boy Scouts of America, located outside of the United States and not under the jurisdiction of a local council.
